

Mr. Isbester was a member of Nickle Lodge, A.F. & A.M., Sudbury. Latterly he had been associated with the firm of Chambers, McQuigge & McCaffrey. He was born at Ottawa.

Surviving are his wife, two sons, two brothers and a sister. Sons are Lieut. James Isbester, of the Royal Engineers, now overseas, and Alex, at home. Brothers Colin, Ottawa; and Lieut. Col. Malcolm Isbester, Kingston. The sister is Mrs. J.G.McLaren, Montreal.
