Brant, Isaac	Oldest son of Joseph Brant.
Brant, John	Youngest son of Joseph Brant.
John, Peter	Was wounded in the thigh at the battle of Brant's Ford, November 1814
Johnson, John Smoke	Was present at the actions at Lewiston, the Cross Roads, Fort Erie, Beaver Dams, Niagara, Brant's Ford, Chippawa, Queenston, Lundy's Lane and Stoney Creek.
Johnson, William	Was present at Lewiston, Lundy's Lane, the Cross Roads, Creek and all battles his father John Smoke fought at.
Karaghkontye, (David Davids)	A chief by right given though courtesy to a younger brother, but acted as a chief throughout the conflict. Was wounded through both thighs at the Battle of Brant's Ford, November 1814. Was about forty years of age.
Kariwio, George Seth	Was wounded in the sholder at Fort George May 27, 1813
Kearayawa, Peter	Was wounded badly through the body at Queenston, October 13, 1812
Henwendeshon, (Henry Aaron Hill)	A faithful warrior on all occasions. Was wounded badly through the hand and thigh at the Battle of Brant's Ford, November 1814.
Skayouwio	Was wounded in the thigh at Fort Erie
Tchioghrokwa, Adam	Was wounded through the thigh at the Crossroads, September 1813
Tehowagherengaraghkwe n, (Thomas Davis)	An old war chief who served in the Revolutionary War and the War of 1812. Was about sixty years of age.
Thearogeagoa	Was wounded severely through the body at Queenston which disabled him from hunting.
