Having lately met with a small Tract from America containing the Speeches of some of the Indian Tribes on different occasions, I think it desirable they should be more generally known. That reported by the Sweedish Missionary having passed two translations, has thereby lost somewhat of the native Indian simplicity, it however retains too much of the Comprehensive Idea of the Indian, as well as too much valuable instruction to be omited. I believe beyond a doubt that all Mankind whereever situated and however circumstanced assuredly partake of the consequences of the Fall, though they should never have heard of Adam; and on the other hand through the Mercy and Justice of God, not a single individual of Adam's Race the World over is left without a Witness for him in the Heart, and though they may never have heard of the name of Christ, they partake of the benefit of his offering and sacrifice for the redemption of Mankind; and if they are faithful to the Light of Christ which it is said "Lighteth every Man that cometh into the World" it will not only discover evil from Good and Good from Evil, but will incline to the Good, and thus prove saving to the Soul; and that in the World to come such will have a portion of happiness, consistent with the Wisdom of God, and the degree of knowledge so afforded of himself,
