Bruce, Mohawk-Sioux, commissioner of Indian affairs; Forrest Gerard, Blackfoot, who presented the award, and Robert L. Bennett, Oneida. The award was instituted when the Indian Council Fire was formed here, in Chicago, in 1933 during A Century of Progress exposition.

Red Capitalism Could Help Poor Indian Reserves

MONTREAL: Red capitalism could help impoverished Indian reserves, the president of the Alberta Indian Association said Thursday. Harold Cardinal, also author of the Unjust Society, a biting critique of white treatment of Indians, was explaining an agreement just signed between a trailer manufacturer and the Blood tribe of Lethbridge, Alta., to a McGill University teach-in on Indian affairs. The company has agreed to finance a factory which will eventually be owned and managed by the Indians themselves, he said. "This will generate jobs and income within the confines of the reserve," he said. "It points out there are viable alternatives for the red man - other than the destructive framework of the Indian white paper." The federal government white paper has proposed turning over responsibility for Indian affairs to the provinces and has been widely attacked by Indians. Mr. Cardinal suggested that the Indian movement could use the techniques of anti-war and civil rights protest. "They made the most powerful government on the face of the earth stop and consider perhaps they're not right on Vietnam," Mr. Cardinal said. "We should do the same." Ojibway Fred Kelly from Kenora, Ont., then explained Red Power, a movement of young militant Indians strong in parts of the west and Ontario. "It is the quest for self-determination and the struggle the Indian people have to achieve this - by whatever means necessary." Walter Curry, president of the Indian-Eskimo Association of Canada which also includes whites as members, noted words such as mulatto, half-breed and nigger created by "Western Christian civilization to apply to skins other than white." "You wouldn't call the son or daughter of a half-breed: what an awful word to confer on a man who has the blood of two races coursing through his veins. "You wouldn't call the son or daughter of an English and French marriage a half-breed. Think about it. If you use these words, it reveals something about yourself."
