Governor General's Reply to Chiefs of Six Nations (cont'd):

Happily now we are called upon to assist in extending the prosperity of the country by Arts of peace, which are more abiding than the triumphs of war.

The Chief, to whose memory you are now raising a worthy monument, was among the first to lead your nations into the paths of peace, and the success you have attained in founding and maintaining an industrious and flourishing community following the practice of agriculture, will I hope endure longer even than the memorial which I rejoice to hear will soon be erected, and which will serve to show how Joseph Brant's example of gallantry and loyalty is cherished among his people.

On February 17, 1970, (too late for publication) we received notice from our distributor of an increase in the price of ALL S SUPPLIES beginning March 1, 1970.

After consultation with our staff it was agreed that the only alternative to offset our already strained budget is to publish "Tedawennake" semi-monthly instead of weekly i.e. twice monthly every second and fourth week of the month beginning march 1, 1970. The annual subscription rate will remain the same @\$7.00 and the semi-annual rate @ \$3.50.

The semi-monthly edition will retail at stores for 25 cents each, the editions being somewhat larger than were the weekly editions. This compares favourably at 50 cents monthly with the provious cost at stores of 60 cents monthly. In this way, we will be using less paper which is our greatest expense.

During the first two years of operation our equipment has been all bought and paid for through donations of interested people, sales of special Historical Numbers and subscribers and patrons, all truly appreciated.

It is necessary now to build up a surplus for emergency purposes and we hope this can be accomplished without further increase in subscription price. We are hopeful that our subscribers and patrons will continue their unqualified support as in the past. On remonstrating with the technician for the blank pages in last week's edition, what with the high cost of paper, the answer was "the blank pages were for the people who can't read".
