

Meet Six Nations Council - (cont'd)

In other business, council will have about \$96,000 for the operation and maintenance of reserve roads this year, with the department of highways providing 50 per cent, the department of Indian affairs about \$35,000, and the balance from band funds. Council also approved the normal road bylaw of \$131,000. The road committee assumed control of Indian affairs road funds totalling \$71,000 which forms the department of Indian affairs portion of the total expenditures and part of the department of highways contribution. Council received about 10 trophies in reply to an appeal for Indian trophies from the Reserve to be donated for display at the Six Nations Public Library. More trophies are being sought for the display.
