ROSS POWLESS NAMED WARRIORS' COACH

Ross Powless figures the Ontario Lacrosse Association's new major senior series will be as strong as last year's professional league.

"It should be, all the same players will be in it," says Powless, who Thursday night was named coach of the Brantford Warriors.

Pro lacrosse is disbanding for the 1970 season and its players are returning to the OLA in a new six-team league which includes the Warriors.

The other five teams are Brooklin Redmen, Peterborough Petes, Brampton Excelsiors, Huntsville Hawks and Fergus Thistles. The Warriors are scheduled to open the season May 21. Powless, who is replacing Jim Squires as coach, watched Thursday night as trainer Bill Shooter sent the Warriors through their first workout, a one-hour calisthenics drill at the civic centre.

Powless, a member of the lacrosse Hall of Fame, helped organize the Warriors in 1959 and coached them to one Canadian and two Eastern Canada Senior "B" championships before leaving the club at the end of the 1967 season.

Last year he coached Rochester Chiefs to the championship of the North American Lacrosse Association.

Recognized as one of the greatest players in the game's history, Powless helped Peterborough win the Mann Cup four times. He retired as an active player six years ago.
