INDIAN CRAFTS OF ONTARIO

The Honourable John Yaremko, Minister of the Department of Social and Family Services, recently announced a grant of \$200.000 would be given to INDIAN CRAFTS OF ONTARIO, a corporation to develop Indian crafts. The grant has been divided into three parts:

(1) An estimated \$127,000 will be involved in the initial establishment of the Corporation. This amount will cover overhead, purchasing, shipping and marketing of the finished goods.

(2) A further fund of \$33,000 will be set up to provide a pool of supplies and raw materials, e.g. hides, leather, thread and tools.

(3) An additional \$40,000 will be spent in the first year for the development and training of craftsmen and assistant buyers.

Commenting on the grant, Dr. Gilbert Monture, a Mohawk, and Chairman of INDIAN CRAFTS OF ONTARIO, said "It gives the Indian the feeling at long last that the Government is thinking of us." Particularly pleased with the announcement was Art Solomon of Garson, Ontario, who initiated the idea for such a project, he says: "It is an Indian corporation and under the control of Indian craftsmen",
