Moved that this Council gran t permission to Captain Lois Lowry and Lieutenant Sandra Garland of the Salvation Army to reside on the Six Nations Indian Reserve at the Salvation Army Citadel, R.R. #1 Ohsweken, Ontario, for a period of one (1) year. Carried.

Moved that this Council approve the recommendation of the Welfare Committee to approve the expenditure made for Welfare purposes during the month of April, 1970, as \$6,252.72, only 80% of the Nursing Home costs included in total. Carried.

Moved that this Council refer to the matter of penalties into the Sanitation By-Law to the next meeting of the Board of Health and an invitation to be extended to Dr. G. J. Nicholas, Medical Officer of Health for the Six Nations Indian Reserve to help up-date the Health By-Law. Also that all the By-Laws be referred to the respective committees for up-dating. Carried.

Moved that this Council approve the recommendation of the Lands Committee to approve the twelve transfers of land.

Moved that the purchase of the proposed area of the Sewage Lagoon, according to plan prepared by Wm. L. Sears, be left open for a special meeting to be called by the Chief Councillor, Richard Isaac. Carried.

Moved that this Council request Mr. L. R. Oakley, Medical Services Branch, Department of National Health and Welfare, 55 St. Clair Avenue, East, Toronto 7, Ontario, to investigate the pollution danger in regard to a proposed Manure Dump on the property of Mrs. Florence Wilson, No. 162 Upper Cayuga, in the North Half of Lot 5, Concession 3, Township of Oneida, near the Boston Creek. Carried.

Moved that this Council approve the five applications for hydro service. Carried.

Moved that this Council approve the Finance Accounts, as presented, excepting the Account of \$30.00 from the Six Nations Singer's Society: Total \$1,807.93. Carried.
