

SIX NATIONS NEWS

MICHAEL CAPTON, 13, CHAMPION PLOWMAN

FOLLOWING FAMILY TRADITION, Michael Capton, 13 of R2 Ohsweken won the Eaton's of Canada junior championship trophy at Saturday's Brant County and Six Nations joint plowing match, October 31, 1970.

The match was held on the Tuscarora Township farm of John Capton.

The trophy was awarded to the competitor who has not passed his or her 18th birthday and who has the best plowed land using a mounted plow with two or more furrows.

Shelby Williams of R2 Ohsweken won the prize for the best-plowed land in a field.

OTHER WINNERS

Class winners in order of first, second and third: --Horses, jointer plows, open six entries, Cecil Wells, R2 Paris; Emerson Green, RZ Ohsweken; Wray Stirling, R9 Dunnville.

--Tractor trailer or mounted plows, two or more furrows to measure not less than 10 inches, open, five entries, Shelby Williams, R2 Ohsweken Lloyd Reece, R2 St. Ann's; John Capton, R2 Ohsweken.

--Tractors, open, boys or girls 16 years and under, five entries, Wayne Huffman, Rí Hagersville; Michael Capton, R2 Ohsweken; Gary Porter, R2 Ohsweken.

Several classes were cancelled due to the lack of good plowing land which was the result of three days' rain previous to the match.
