Nevertheless, said Councillor Nina Burnham, the newly-established arena committee plans to continue meetings to bring the proposal to a reality.

The arena committee was appointed Sunday during a meeting of about 25 persons in the Ohsweken community hall to discuss means of promoting the project.

Council gave Miss Burnham permission to use the community hall dining room for an arena committee meeting this Sunday to thrash out further details. It was scheduled for 10 a.m.

The five-man committee consists of President Elton VanEvery; Vice-President Victor Porter; Secretary Welby Johnson; Treasurer John Burnham and Public Relations Director Sidney Henhawk.

The Six Nations community established an arena committee in 1967 as a Centennial project but negotiations for grant bogged down because the reserve is not considered a municipality.

Interest in the project declined and finally disappeared.

The issue was raised at a council meeting last month but some councillors objected to the cost estimated at between \$150,000 to \$250,000. They felt enough support could not be found. Councillor William White was suggested funds could be raised from gypsum royalties paid annually to the elected council.
