Tap Water Soon At Ohsweken (continued)

Maple Engineering Construction of Rexdale are installing the treatment plant and Tricadian Developments Limited of Agincourt are installing the distribution system. Operation and maintenance of the system will be handled by the Six Nations water commission.

The system will include a standpipe so pure water will be available for other residents of the reserve who want to carry it to their homes.

Water consumption will be metered and rates will be \$3 per 3,000 gallons a month and \$2 for each additional 1,000 gallons.

The water is drawn from a reservoir on MacKenzie Creek which runs through the reserve. It is pumped to the treatment plant and then introduced under pressure into the distribution system.

The new system, in addition to making tap water available, also will relieve many residents' minds concerning fire protection.

Village officials have expressed hopes for the system to provide the village with expansion and perhaps industry.

The next step in the community planning goals for Ohsweken is sanitary sewage disposal which the village is already considering.
