

Infectious Hepatitis (cont'd)What To Do

Since there is a mild epidemic on the Reserve:

1. Do not visit in homes where they have Infectious Hepatitis.
2. Do not allow people to visit you if you have it in your home.
3. Watch your children for signs of the disease and consult your doctor at once.
4. Follow his instructions regarding treatment, diet and isolation of the patient.
5. Observe Community Health Rules:
 - a) Wash hands carefully after going to the bathroom and before meals and make sure your children follow this practice.
 - b) Make sure that no sewage gets into your water supply. If your water supply is doubtful, boil it 15 minutes.
 - c) Scrub toilet seats daily with plenty of soap and water.

We repeat, good sanitation and personal hygiene are the surest means of halting the spread of this disease.

Call your doctor or Public Health Nurse if you are at all worried.
