

# Wawanosh To the Grave

The funeral of the late Mr. Allan Johnson took place this morning upon the arrival of the train from Toronto. The cortege proceeded from the Market street depot to the Mohawk church where a number of Brantford friends, and others from the Six Nations reserve, had assembled. Rev. O. H. P. Owen officiated and two favorite hymns of the deceased were sung, "Nearer My God to Thee" and "What a Friend We Have in Jesus." Miss Eva Johnson, a sister, and the only surviving member of the family of the late Chief G. H. M. and Mrs. Johnson, accompanied the remains from Toronto, and also Col. MacQueen, Mr. F. Loft and Mr. Rathbone.

The pall-bearers were Chief A. G. Smith, F. Frank, F. Loft, H. Hill, F. D. Reville and Mr. Rathbone.

The floral tributes were exceedingly numerous and included a beautiful wreath from the U. E. Loyalists of Toronto.

Interment was made in the Mohawk burying ground, adjacent to the tomb of Chief Joseph Brant.
