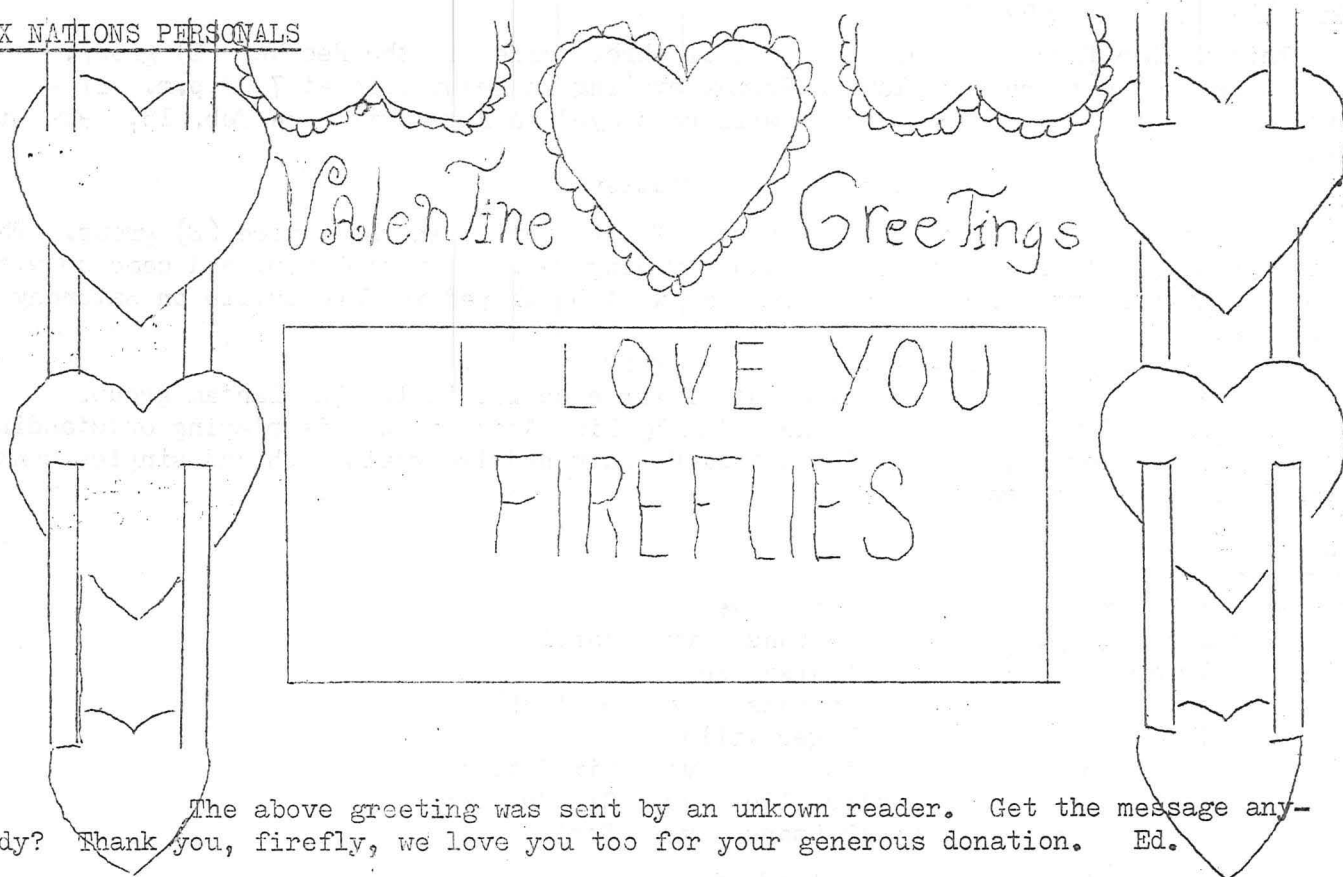


SIX NATIONS PERSONALS
