Chapter Five - The General Appearance of the Early Indian

"The stature of the men averages five feet ten inches; that of the women averages five feet. Both males and females are well formed; the muscles and bones of the former are smaller in proportion than those of the latter, a fact which, no doubt, arises from the women having to perform the heavy drudgeries of an Indian life. The men are built more for fleetness than for strength; they are great walkers, and runners, and think nothing of walking forty or fifty miles a day. The women have larger heads than the men, round and broad at the top, high cheek bones, and black eyes, while many have large Roman noses; their mouths and lips in general are large, their teeth good and white, their hair jet black and straight.
