GOD USED A JAIL CELL TO BRING ME TO HIMSELF

Just a little over three years have passed since I was freed from the bondage of alcohol, and freed from the slavery of tobacco.

So possessed was I by alcohol, that I finally came into contact with the law. For the first time in my life, I learned what the inside of a cell was like, and it makes a guy do some pretty serious thinking.

It was while in jail that the pastor of our local church at home, paid me a visit and brought me a very precious gift which I am so thankful to God for. What was it? A hacksaw perhaps? No, hardly that, but it had the same effect for it released me from the sin 'that doth so easily beset me', as the apostle Paul says in the Scripture. In my case, it was alcohol that had made a fool out of me time and time again, to finally land me in jail.

The precious gift this faithful master brought to me was the gospel of Jesus Christ. He told me how God loved me even here in this present state, and how, if I were to go on through life without the Saviour, who knows where I might end up. God began to convince me by His Holy Spirit. I definitely heard Him speaking to me. Right then and there, I cried the sinners prayer in my heart, "God be merciful to me, a sinner.", and I took Christ as my Saviour.

I'm glad that I now can say as Joshua said, "As for me and my house, we will serve the Lord." (Joshua 24:15)

I read in Acts 4:12, "neither is there Salvation in any other, for there is no other name given under Heaven whereby we must be saved."
