

SIX NATIONS COUNCIL MEETING-TUESDAY, APRIL 3, 1973

Minutes of Council Meetings March 20, March 14, and March 29, 1973 were adopted as read.

Council approved the request of Rev. Ronald Seanor for permission to reside in the United Church Mense, Ohsweken for a period of one year.

Council decided to forward an invitation to the Unemployment Insurance Commission, Hamilton, Ont., for an official to meet with the Six Nations Council on Tuesday April 17, 1973 to answer some questions in relation to the filing of T4's and T4 Summary forms for students.

Mr. Doug Davis of Wellandport attended Council to speak in relation to the Opportunities for Youth program for a group of Metis and Non-status Indians from Hamilton. Mr. Davis told Council that a restriction had been put on their grant; that their program would not be approved if Six Nations Council did not approve their request. He asked permission to bring a group, ranging in age from 6 to 14 years, to the reserve for a week-end or any two days during the week to compete in sports events, to participate in a culture program and a camp-out. Their program is called "Indian Summer '73" and involves 75 children and 10 leaders. Council granted their request.

Council decided to invite Mr. George Caswell of Koster-Caswell, Limited to meet with the Six Nations Council on Thursday, April 5, 1973 to answer some questions in relation to the appraisal on the Mohawk Chapel.

Council decided to submit the Construction and Maintenance Road Program as authorized for subsidy allocation for 1973 in the amounts of \$80,000.00 for construction and \$50,000.00 for Maintenance, pursuant to the Pub-

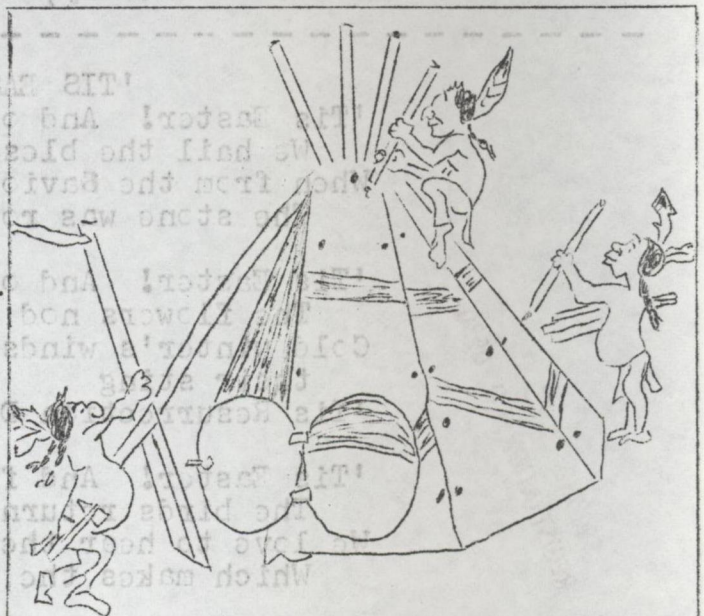
lic Transportation and Highway Improvement Act.

Council decided to inquire at the next meeting of the Association of Iroquois and Allied Indians, if there is some way in which the Six Nations Council can support the Research Program in obtaining funds from Indian Affairs.

Council decided that copies of the letter, dated March 29, 1973, from N. Vander Giessen, P. Engineer, Assistant Regional Engineer, Ontario, in relation to the Ohsweken Village Streets, be forwarded to all members of the Six Nations Water Committee.

Council passed a resolution to discuss the draft By-laws at a special meeting.

Council discussed a letter, dated March 22, 1973, from Derek Blackburn, M.P. in relation to the condition of the Reserve roads. Council decided to refer the letter to the Six Nations Roads Committee Chairman, Leonard Staats.
