

NEW CREDIT HAS A NEW CHIEF

Fred King, 53, became the new Elect-ed Chief Councillor of New Credit Reserve, Saturday, December 8, 1973 at their elections when he received 74 votes while incumbent Frank LaForme received 70.



148 ballots were cast with four spoiled, The Council seats were taken by five incumbents and one newcomer, Wesley Sault.

Chief councillor

Since New Credit is classed as one electoral district, a voter picks five councillors from one ballot. From the 148 votes, Clayton Tobicoe received 92, Graham King, 85, Wesley Sault, 85, Marvin LaForme, 84 and Allan Sault, 70. Candidates defeated were Lonny King, Bryan La-Forme and Ward Laforme.

Defeated Candidate for Chief, Frank LaForme had served two terms and prior to that Chief Fred King had served for a number of years.

The five Councillors and Chief took office for 1974-75, December 17, 1973.
