Hagersville - Jan. 17, 1973.
 The victory of the Bruins against the Spoilers in to-night's game moved them into a first place tie with the latter in this league. Smoothtown Bruins won the game 5-1.

At the end of the first period the score was tied 1-1. Bobby Smith scored for the Spoilers and Bill Squires for the Bruins. Two penalties were called in this period.
