

Recipes (continued)

This is a nutritious whole meal in one dish, easy to prepare and easy on the budget.

Take a casserole large enough to suit the needs of your family and fill with the following ingredients:

Sliced raw potatoes, onions and carrots, hamburger or ground beef chuck.

Place these in the dish in layers repeated until it is full, seasoned with salt and pepper. Cover with enough canned tomato soup, diluted with milk, to cover the ingredients. Cover and cook in a 375° oven until well done - about 1 3/4 hrs. for a 2 qt. casserole.

Tomato juice or canned tomatoes may be substituted for the liquid. (If you are allergic to fats, lightly fry the hamburger until the pinkish colour disappears and drain off fat before adding.)
