STATISTICS (by P.S. - S.S. #2)

The population of this country is 20 million, but there are 8 million over sixty-two years of age, leaving 12 million to do the work. People under twenty-one total 7 million, which leaves 5 million to do the work. Then there are 2 million who are employed by the government and that leaves 3 million to do the work. One million are in the armed forces, leaving 2 million to do the work. Deduct 1,900,000 housewives, who actually do nothing but housework, and that leaves 100,000 to do the work. There are 60,000 hospitals, institutions, and the like with the sick and invalided, and that leaves 40,000 people. But 30,000 of these are derelicts or others who will not work, so that leaves 10,000 to do the work.
