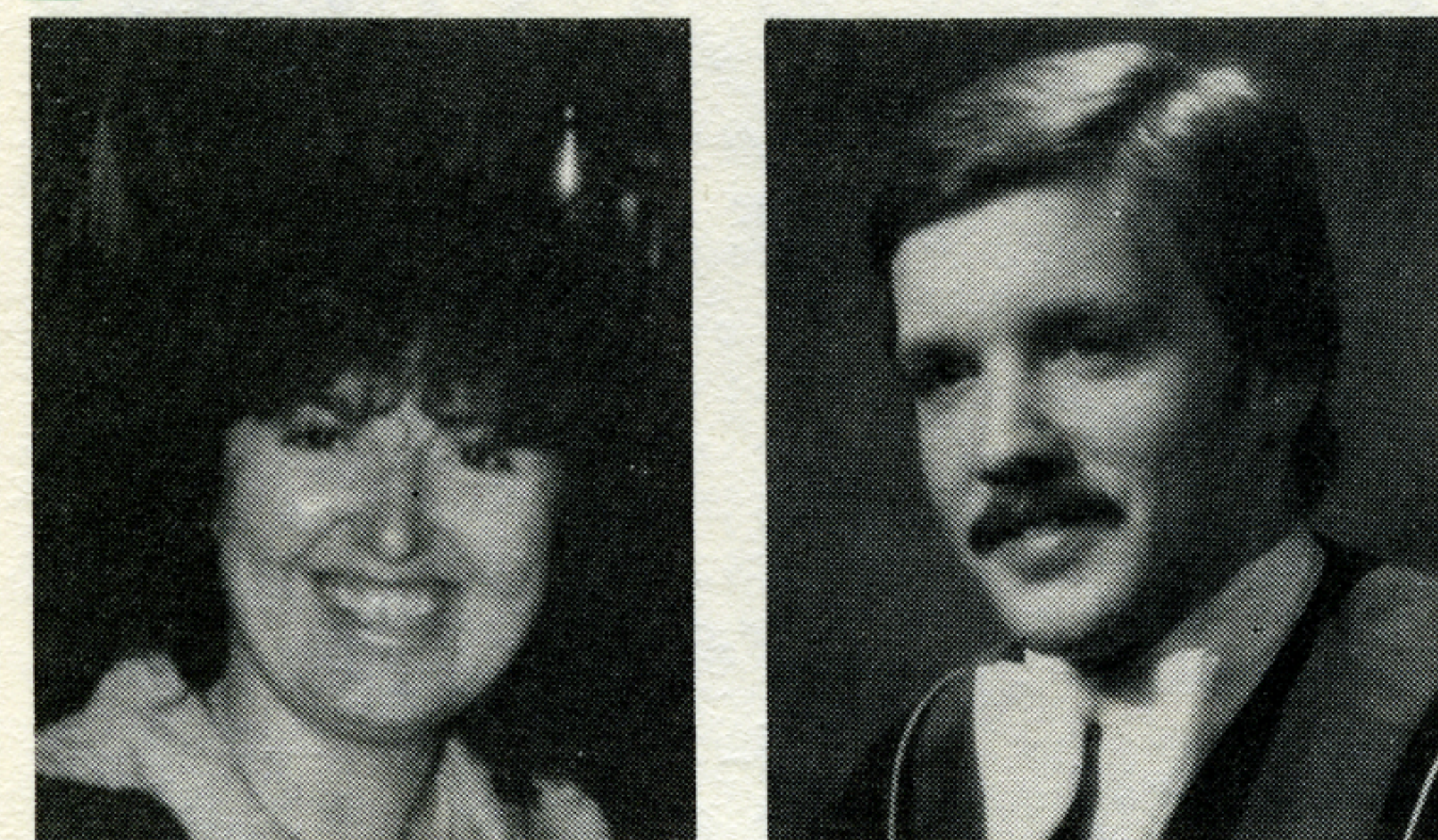

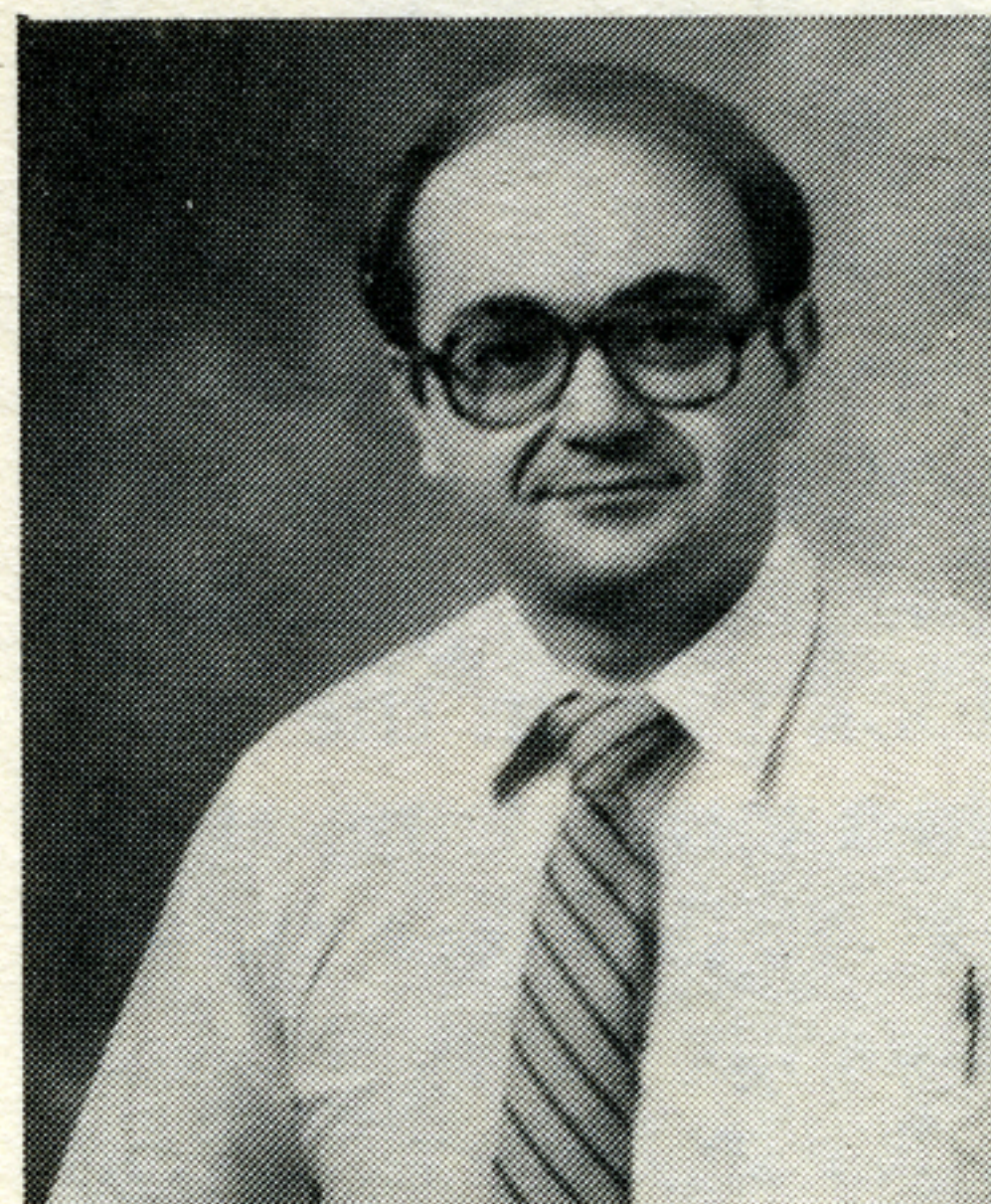
"I'm willing to work to establish a viable alumni association and contribute to the betterment of St. Jerome's College," says Paul. "I think the time has come for such an endeavour."
