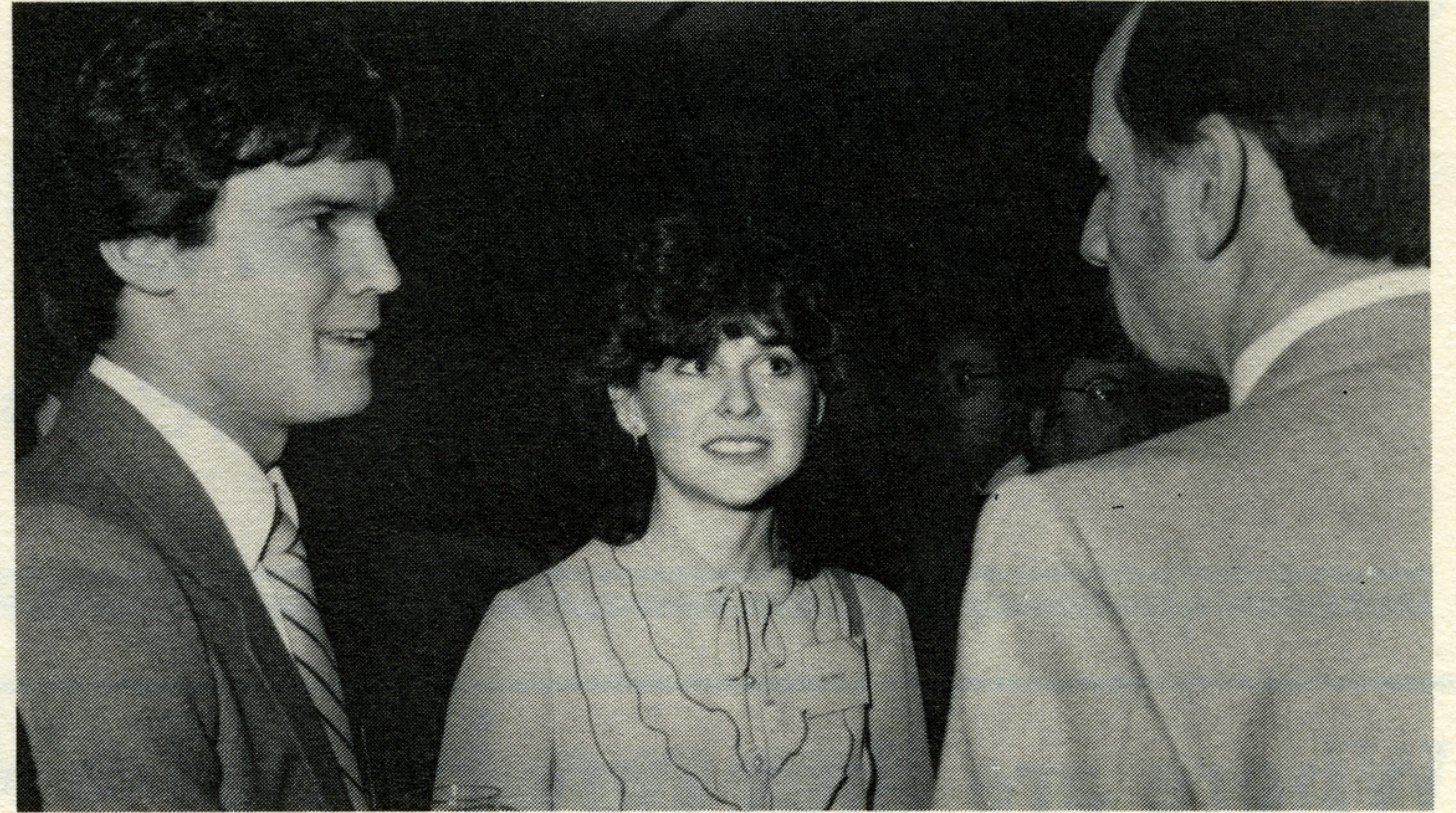


Alumni News

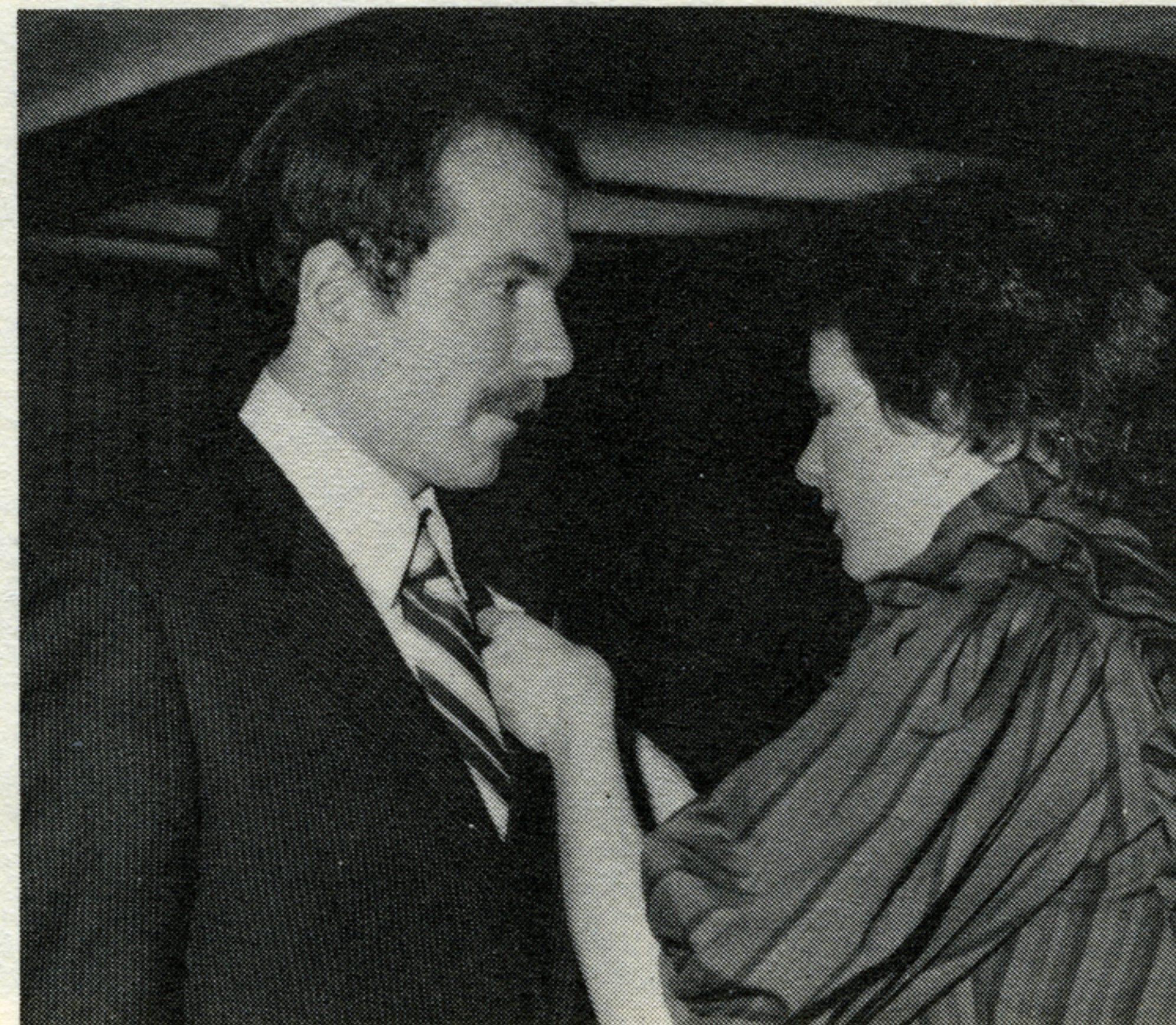
