PROVINCIAL OFFICERS IN ALL PRINCIPAL TOWNS

Specially to Look After Places Where
No Police and Enforce
O. T. A., Etc.

Mr. F. L. Smiley, Crown Attorney, forwards the following item to The Advance with the information that the Attorney-General of the Province requests its publication as a "news item." In other words the Attorney General requests free advertising where payment should be made in the ordinary way. But because it is the season of good will and generosity The Advance for once is letting her go as she looks.

In order to assist in the prompt and satisfactory administration of justice, the Attorney General is arranging to place a Provincial Constable in the principal towns of the Province under the direction of the Crown Attorney.

It will be the duty of this Officer to attend, under the direction of the Crown Attorney, to police work in connection with all parts of the District where there is no Police Force. In cities and towns having a Force, while of course it is the Provincial Officer's duty to give what assistance is necessary, he will not relieve the local police of their duty or interfere with their activities.

It will be his duty to enforce the Criminal Code, the Ontario Temperance Act and any Provincial Statutes, but not of course Municipal By-Laws, which of necessity will be left to the Municipal Authorities.

It is hoped that the appointment of these officers will result in a greatly improved administration of Justice especially in the rural districts. All complaints of criminal offences, offences against sections of the O.T.A. or offences against other provincial Statutes should be made to the Crown Attorney who is responsible for the enforcement of the law in this County.

"THE CONFESSION," ONE OF SUPERIOR MOTION FILMS.

Because of the sanctity of the confessional the priest can not give the information necessary to clear his brother, but believes that right will eventually prevail. The brother escapes from prison on the eve of his execution and the priest goes in search of him and of the murderer so that justice may not be flouted. After many thrilling scenes, in which the acting is remarkably good, the story is brought to a happy and artistic ending.


