Timmins News in Brief

The Timmins Band is giving a Carnival in the Rink on Thursday evening of next week, Feb. 10th.

Members of the Columbus Club are requested to be at King's Hall at 7 o'clock sharp for the banquet tomorrow (Thursday) evening.

Cobalt G.W.V.A. is supporting the application of Major John D. Mackay, formerly of the 59th Batt., for the post of Registrar and Master of Titles of the District of Temiskaming in succession to the late W. H. Lewis, deceased.

Last week The Haileyburian, referred to Iroquois Falls Hockey Team as "the strongest and fastest hockey organization in the N.O.H.A." That was, of course, before the game between Porcupine and the Falls at the Paper Town on Friday last.

The Board of Arbitration in the case of the Town of Matheson against the T. & N. O. Railway re the 1916 fire has commenced its sessions at Matheson to-day. 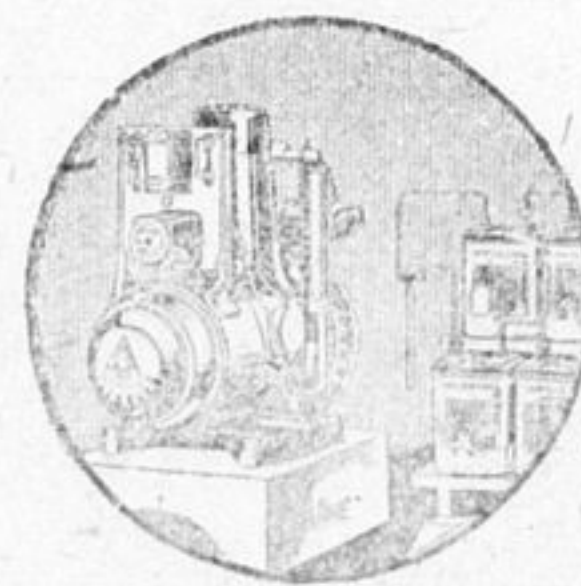
