

## DOME PRODUCED NEARLY \$2,000,000 IN THE YEAR

Annual Report to March 31st. Shows Difficult Year but Prospects Very Bright Now.

The annual report of the Dome Mines Company Limited has been issued. It covered the period of the year ending March 31st, 1921. The principal points of the report show

that the average ore milled was \$7.11 in gold per ton; 273,700 tons were milled; and the total production was \$1,946,403. During the year a total of 289,789 tons was hoisted, of which 16,089 tons were waste.

Against the production of \$1,946,403.00, there were operating and maintenance expenses of \$1,239,508, leaving a net earning on operations of \$700,894.00. Discount and exchange premiums totalled \$183,083.00, and other revenue \$64,271.00, the total re-

venue being \$954,250.00. The depreciation and depletion is charged off at

\$619,357.00, and the Dominion taxes at \$41,413.00, leaving a net profit for the year of \$302,479.00.

Ore equivalent in value to that milled has been exposed in the operations during the year.

The surplus on March 31, 1920, was \$308,615.00. The surplus on March 31, 1921, was \$192,445.00, from which dividend payment of April 20th, is deducted, leaving net surplus of \$73,279.00. Dividends paid during the year were \$438,333.00.

The assets listed include cash, bonds, bullion, supplies, etc., totalling \$1,817,994.00, over a million dollars being in Dominion and Provincial bonds.

During the year the Dome had unusual difficulties to overcome, all the special difficulties being outside the control of the Mine. During the first nine months of the Mine's year labour was scarce and the general operating efficiency thus kept low. When the labour conditions improved, there came a shortage in power, owing to low water, and operations had to be carried on largely by steam power supplied by the use of coal. This caused a raise in costs to \$5.03 per ton for the three months this year. When power was again available the costs were dropped down to \$3.75 per ton. The average costs for the year ending March 31st, were \$4.55 per ton, this high figure being due chiefly to the failure to secure the required electric power through part of the year. The efficiency with which the Dome Mine is conducted is shown by the fact that \$4.55 is considered as a high operating cost average, and that as low a figure as \$3.75 per ton is reached these days.

While the report necessarily explains the problems that made profitable mining difficult during the year, the future is referred to with much optimism. Everything now seems in the Mine's favour, labour, power, costs, etc., and the future appears very promising.

During the year the tenth level orebody has been drifted on for 360 feet with very gratifying results. Moil samples showed an average of \$26.00 per ton. The report however, allows for dilution, and suggests that the grade for actual mining will be at least \$10.00 to \$12.00. A width of 22 feet in one place is referred to and other evidences are given of a large body of highly profitable ore, which is all regarded as highly satisfactory.


## THE COMEDY HIT OF THE YEAR AT NEW EMPIRE






