The proposal has been made to have THE SEVEN NATIONS this year hold a general observance of Magna Charta Day, Wednesday, June 15th. The matter has been very ably expounded by Mr. J. W. Hamilton, of St. Paul, Minn., who has interested the management of the Canadian Bank of Commerce, which in turn has made use of its branches to give the question publicity.
