The schools here are expected to close Friday of next week, June 24th.

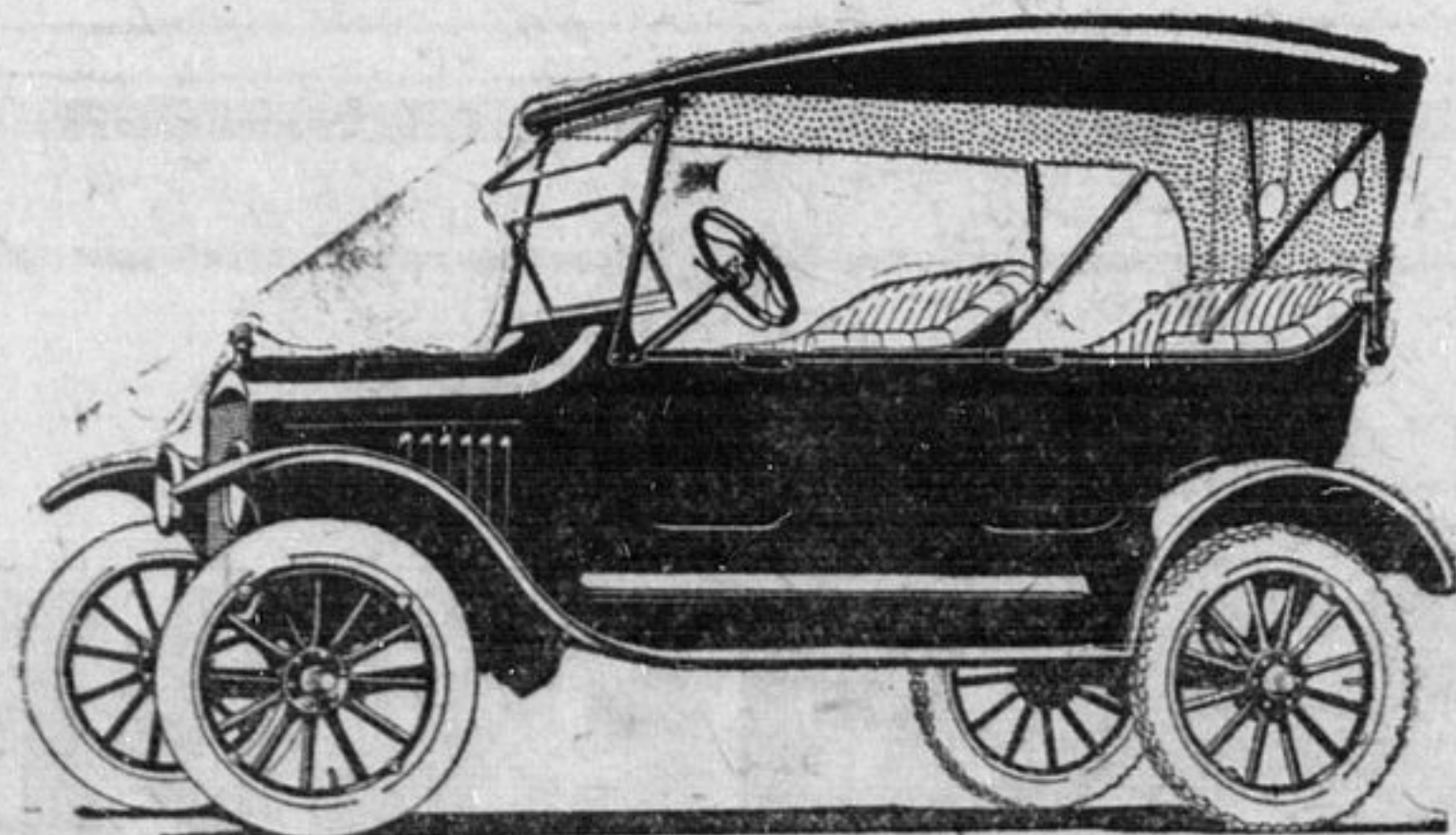
