HOLLINGER WINS FIRST GAME IN MINES LEAGUE

Dome Baseball Boys Lose Opener in League, with Heavy Score Against Them.

The first game in the Porcupine Mines Baseball League,—Hollinger vs. Dome,—has opened the regular baseball season with an unusual score. Hollinger won the game with the official tally as 9 to 2.

Neither team were in their best form, the season being young yet, but the Dome almost from the opening was shown to be outclassed. Both teams, however, put up an interesting exhibition of ball and the game would suggest that there will be lots of good baseball here before the season is over.

Roy Worters umpired the game to the general satisfaction of all. There was a good crowd out to witness this first league game, and much interest and enthusiasm shown. As the day was very hot and the most of the ground unprotected from the sun, the need of a covered grand stand was "burned in" as it were.

The following official summary of

the game is given by Mr. J. N. Levine who kept the score for the match:—

1st. innings:
Dome—Shepherd singled over 2nd. Thomas repeated, Shepherd going to second. Parnell struck out. Shepherd out stealing third, Thomas going to second on the play. Fell rolled to McCoy for the third out. 0 runs, 2 hits, 0 errors.

Hollinger—McLean flied to centre field. King out, Mason to Parnell. Scully singled over second. Spring also singled, sending Scully to third. Lake doubled to centre field, scoring Scully and Spring, and Lake going to third, when Ingram started to play football with the baseball. McCoy walked. Airth singled, scoring Lake and McCoy. Airth out stealing. 4 runs, 4 hits, 1 error.

2nd. innings:
Dome—Mansfield struck out. Howie safe when Scully threw wild to McCoy, and went to second. Mason fanned. Howie died on an attempted steal. 0 runs, 0 hits, 1 error.

Hollinger—Sippola, the continuous talking machine, out, Howie to Parnell. Haquist out, Thomas to Parnell. McLean out, Mansfield to Parnell. 0 runs, 0 hits, 0 error.

3rd. innings:
Dome—Ingram out, Sippola to McCoy. Clark out, Oscar to McCoy.

Shepherd fanned. 0 runs, 0 hits, 0 errors.

Hollinger—King singled over third. Scully sacrificed, sending him along to second. Spring out, Fell to Parnell, King going to third on the play. Lake called out on strikes. 0 runs, 1 hit, 0 errors.

4th. innings:
Dome—Thomas struck out. Parnell safe on first and went to second when Scully threw wild to first. It should have been an easy out. Fell struck out. Mansfield singled scoring Parnell. Mansfield died stealing. 1 run, 1 hit, 1 error.

Hollinger—McCoy doubled to centre field. Airth singled over third base, scoring McCoy. Airth out stealing second. Sippola doubled to left, advanced to third on a passed ball and scored on a wild pitch. Oscar walked and was forced at second base on McLean's fielder's choice. McLean stole second and scored on King's single. Scully popped to Fell. 3 runs, 3 hits, 2 errors.

5th. innings:
Dome—Howie out, Scully to McCoy. Mason and Ingram whipped the air. 0 runs, 0 hits, 0 errors.

Hollinger—Spring safe when Howie fumbled his grounder. Lake out. Thomas to Parnell. Spring going to second. McCoy struck out. Airth

popped to Fell. 0 runs, 0 hits, 1 error.

6th. innings:
Dome—Lake now pitching for Hollinger, Burns going to centre field. Mortson batting for Clark got a life when Spring fumbled his grounder. Shepherd out, Spring to McCoy, Mortson going to second. Thomas flied to McLean. Parnell out, Scully to McCoy. 0 runs, 0 hits, 1 error.

Hollinger—Ellis now pitching for Dome, Thomas taking third and Campbell going to right. Sippola singled and stole second. Oscar flied to Mansfield. McLean singled over third, scoring Sippola. McLean going to second on a passed ball. King hit in front of the plate for an easy out. Scully walked. Spring called out on strikes. 1 run, 2 hits, 1 error.

7th. innings:
Dome—Fell out, Lake to McCoy. Mansfield and Ellis struck out. 0 runs, 0 hits, 0 errors.

Hollinger—Lake out, Fell to Parnell. McCoy singled and was at second on Airth's ground to short. Sippola out Mansfield to Parnell. 0 runs, 1 hit, 0 errors.

8th. innings:
Dome—Campbell singled and went to second on a passed ball. Ingram struck out. Mortson out, Lake to McCoy, Campbell going to third. Burns gathered in Shepherd's fly. 0 runs, 1 hit, 0 errors.

Hollinger—Burns walked. Advanced to second and third on passed balls. McLean singled, scoring Burns. King struck out. McLean out trying to steal home. Scully called out on strikes. 1 run, 1 hit, 0 errors.

9th. innings:
Dome—Thomas safe when Spring fell asleep in handling his pop fly. Thomas stole second and died stealing third. Parnell fanned. Fell singled. Mansfield hit by pitched ball. Ellis doubled, hitting Fell. Campbell flied to McLean for the third and last out. 1 run, 2 hits, 1 error.

Hollinger did not take its last innings.

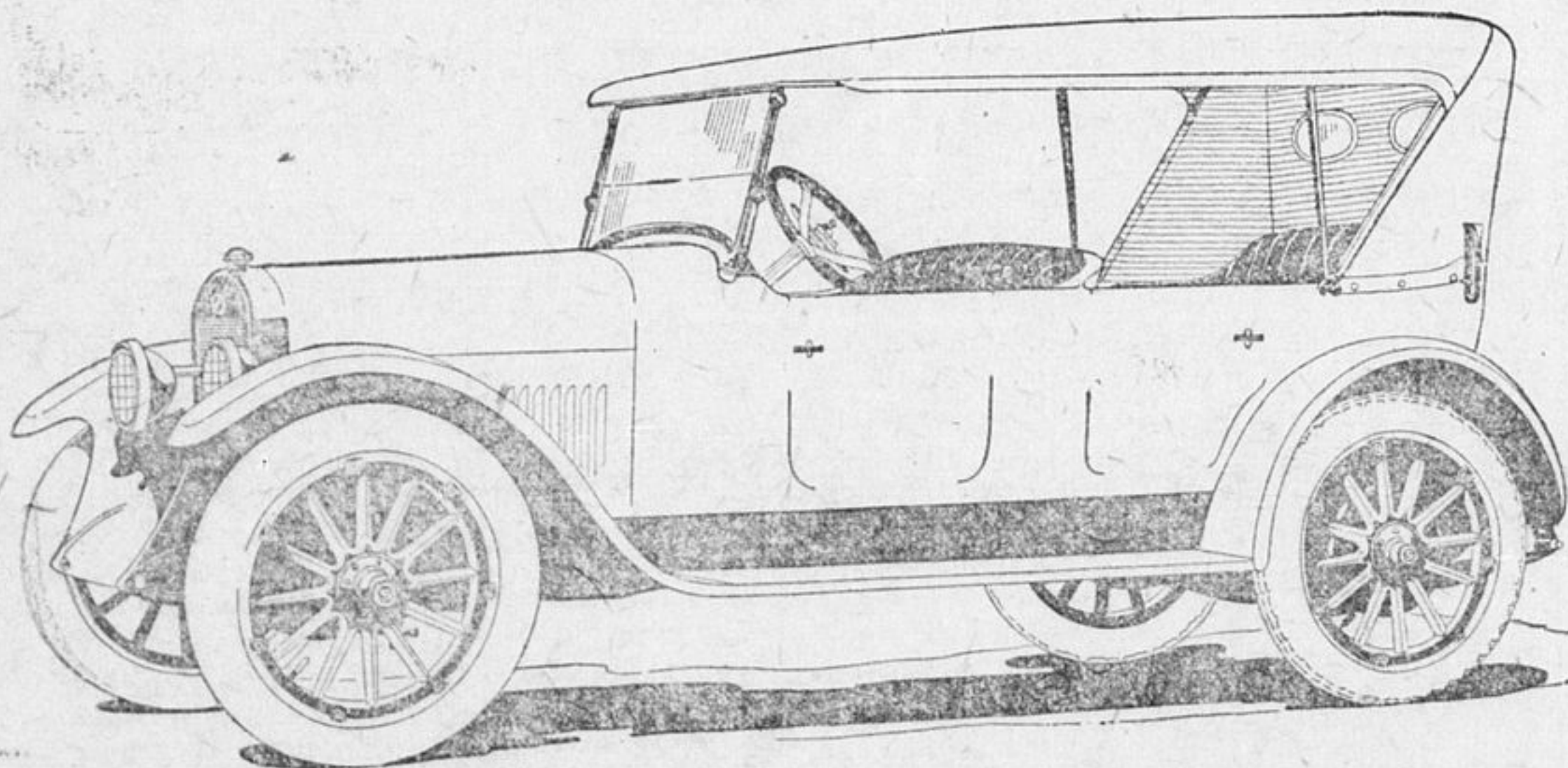
