Speaking of the new stock yards at New Liskeard, providing encouragement along the stock farming line, The New Liskeard Speaker says:-

"The T. & N. O. Commission through Mr. E. M. Goodman, agent, have turned a portion of the land formerly used by the Grant-Kennedy Company, into a stock yard, while the switch is used in running cars back and forward to the new stock yard where live stock pens, each 30 x 70 ft. have been made, together with runways so that stock can walk into the freight cars. The pens are made from 2 x 6 in number and the fence is 6 ft high. All that is now needed to complete the undertaking is the erection of feeding throughs, and the installa-

tion of water, which will be done. In addition to the stock pens, two platforms for handling automobiles and heavy freight have also been erected, one to put on or take out freight at the side of the car, and the easy as possible.


