Among the other rules and regulations noted in the Act the following may be of interest:-

Lord's Day, hunt, take, kill or destroy any game, or use any gun or other engine for that purpose.

Section 13-Licenses are necessary for hunting deer. Cow moose, calves, etc., are not to be killed. No resident or non-resident hunter to kill or take more than one deer, bull moose, reindeer or earibou during one season. Two or more persons hunting together and holding licenses may kill rules and regulations relating to huntbut this shall not apply to deer taken under the authority of a special camp in eamp, and such license may be issued to every six persons. No person who has taken or killed any bird or animal suitable for food shall allow or taken a fur-bearing animal shall allow the skin thereof to be destroyed or spoiled. Provision is also made in this section for the restraint of dogs accustomed to pursue deer.
