TEMISKAMING BOARDS OF TRADE ANNUAL MEETING

Important Gathering to be Held in Iroquois Falls On Thursday, Nov. 10th.

The quarterly meeting of the Temiskaming and Northern Ontario Associated Boards of Trade will be held at Iroquois Falls on Thursday morning, November 10th, at 9.30 a.m. This will also be the annual meeting at which the officers for 1922 will be elected.

This meeting of the Associated Boards of Trade is one of the most important gatherings of the year in the North Land. The Associated Boards of Trade being the representatives of all the local Boards of Trade of the North Land, the body naturally should voice the opinions and needs of the whole North Land, and should be a powerful and effective factor in working for the progress of the North Land. During the past year the Temiskaming Associated Boards of Trade, under the able presidency of Mr. R. A. McInnis, of Iroquois Falls, has been able to accomplish much more for the North Land than is generally credited. Even this has been done under certain handicaps, and with a complete co-operation and enthusiasm shown by all sections of the

North Land much greater progress may be made in the work of the Associated Boards of Trade in the future. The quiet, persistent efforts of President McInnis and the other officers has done much to further the spirit of "getting together" and "working together" for the North Land. The usefulness of the Associated Boards of Trade can be greatly extended, if the policy consistently followed in 1921 is retained in 1922, with all getting behind the Associated Boards and working together for the common good.

The important matter for the moment is a large and enthusiastic gathering at Iroquois Falls on Thursday, Nov. 11th. Each local Board of Trade is entitled to send five delegates and the Officers of the Associated Boards of Trade very earnestly request a full representation from each and every Board of Trade of the North Land.

There are a number of very important questions to be dealt with at the meeting at the Falls on the 10th. Every citizen of the North Land should be interested in this meeting and should do all possible in every way to see that it is a success in every way, and that the Associated Boards of Trade starts a new year of its good work with the whole North Land fully co-operating and supporting its good efforts for the advantage and advancement of this country.

CONSTABLE F. LEFEBVRE RE-INSTATED LAST WEEK

Last week Provincial Officer Fred Lefebvre of North Bay was re-instated on the Provincial Police force. He was charged some weeks ago with taking \$10.00 unlawfully from one of the Attorney-General's particular friends, a gent by the name of Salloway, a Greek by nationality, and a "liquor detective" by profession, the latter sounding better than the usual designation by the general public. Lefebvre pleaded not guilty and elected to be tried by a judge. In the meantime he was suspended from his position on the Provincial force. The unfairness of holding the officer out of his position all these months between now and the spring assizes was no doubt apparent to the powers-that-be and accordingly he has been duly re-instated.
