IROQUOIS FALLS WELCOMES NEW COACH, ART. THROOP.

The Broke Hustler this week has the following regarding the new hockey team coach for Iroquois Falls, Mr. Art. Throop, recently a popular resident of Timmins, and an old-timer of the North Land:—

Art Throop, who will coach the Iroquois Falls Hockey Teams this winter, arrived in the Falls Wednesday, November 2, to take charge of the teams, and also to act as Manager of the Arena.

Art Throop is well known in the north country, both as a hockey player and as an icemaker, and needs no

introduction to the boys who have been following hockey. In 1908 and 1909 he played on the Haileybury Team when they were in the N.H.L., and the following year played in the Haileybury Pro Team. He then went to Toronto to join the Tecumsehs, now known as the St. Pats, in the N.H.L. He spent three years in the West, after that, playing two years with Portland and one year with Vancouver. His position in the old seven-man game was mostly rover, and in the six-man game left wing, but no matter where he played, he was an absolutely tireless worker and always kept in A-1 condition. He is in such good condition yet that the boys that want to

catch the Senior Team will have to go some to keep up with them.

He had considerable experience in managing rinks in Haileybury, so good ice both for hockey and skating is assured.

In addition to being a good hockey player, he is a cracker jack good all-round sport, and there is no question but that he will be popular with the hockey fans, for the simple reason that he goes into hockey as he does everything else—with his whole heart and soul. THURSDAY LAST A MILD DAY AT POLICE COURT HERE

Compared to the past six or seven sessions of the police court here, last Thursday was a quiet day though there were a number of cases before Magistrate Atkinson. W. Soper, for an assault upon his wife, was fined \$20.00 and costs. A man named Sheriffs, also from the Mattagami district, paid \$20 and costs, on a charge of being drunk and disorderly. He had attempted to kick in the door of a house at the unseemly hour of 2 o'clock in the morning. The Magistrate made it plain that two o'clock a.m. is the close season for kicking in doors. A couple of others were fined for drunkenness. Labrosse, charged with the shooting of a man some weeks ago at McIntosh Springs was remanded for another week. Charrette, the man injured, is still in Haileybury hospital, and so the case against Labrosse can not be proceeded with until he recovers enough to attend court to give this evidence.

ANKERITE REPORTED TO BE RE-OPENING IN MONTH.

It is understood that the Ankerite Mine will be re-opened in about three weeks or a month. This property is located in Northern Deloro and is equipped with a good mining plant. The Coniagas of Cobalt did some work on the Ankerite in 1917 under an option, the option, however, for some reason or other not being exercised. It was understood at the time, that general conditions arising from the war were responsible for the dropping of the option rather than any lack of merit in the Deloro property. The Ankerite has had a considerable amount of development work, the shaft being down several hundred feet. The work done seems to indicate a promising property, and further encouragement along this line will be found in the success attending other development work recently at other Deloro Township properties. It is understood that Mr. Clifford Smith, E. M., will be in charge of the Ankerite when it re-opens in the next few weeks.

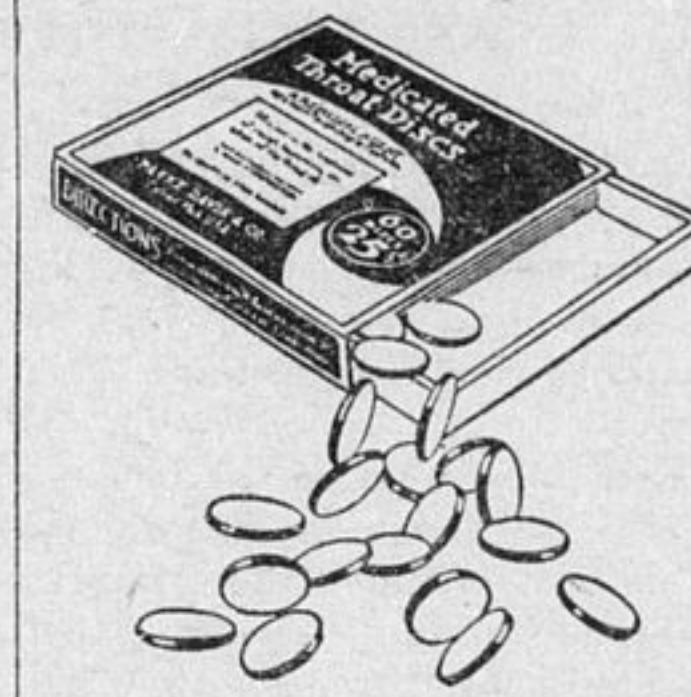

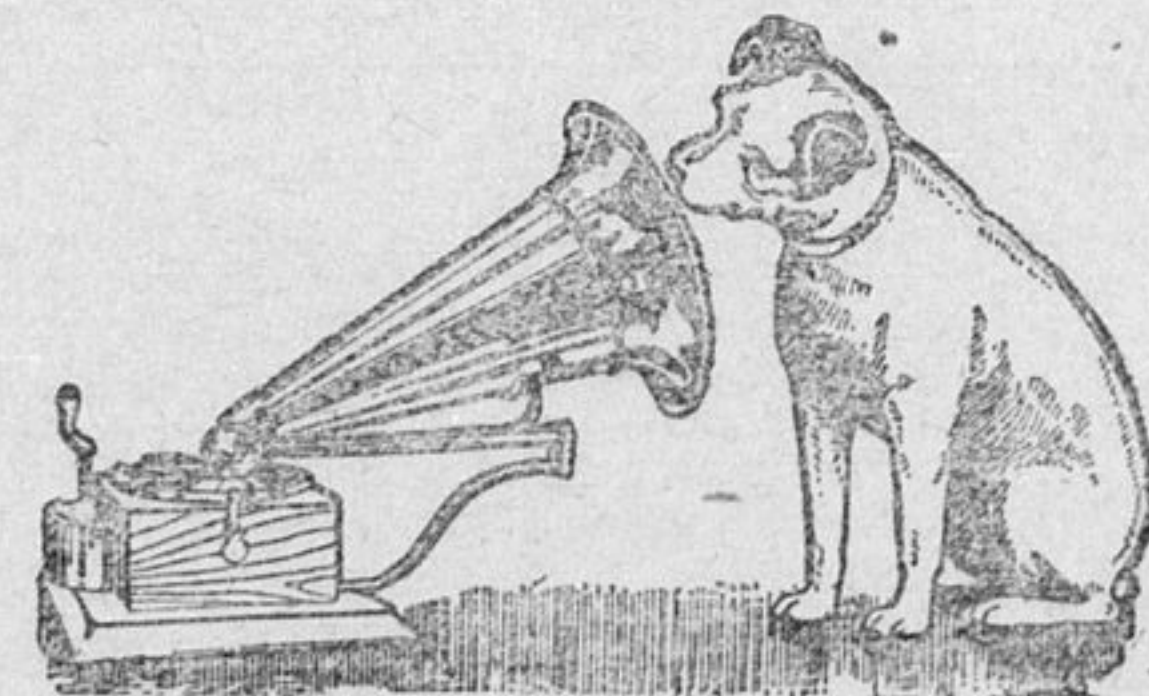
