### ASSURE YOUR VOTE FOR THE DOMINION ELECTION

Returning Officer for Temiskaming Gives Particulars As to How List Will be Made Up.

As there seems to be much general doubt and uncertainty as to the voters' lists for the approaching Dominion Election, official information is published below as supplied by Mr. J. D. Mackay, Returning Officer for the District of Temiskaming. It will be noted that there are two kinds of polling sub-divisions,—rural and urban. The urban polls are those in the five principal towns. In these five urban polls opportunity has been given for men and women to have their names placed on the list by registering. The lists of voters so secured will be revised by His Honour Judge Hartman at courts of revision, the dates for which will be announced later. Accordingly there is still time for any person to have his or her name added, if entitled to a vote. Appeals may also be made against names of persons now on the list. In the rural polls the lists are made up from any information available to the registrars. There is no registration in rural polls, but names may be added or taken off at the sittings in the week of Nov. 21st.

as referred to below. Keeping in mind the two kinds of polls,—urban and rural, the information below should be quite clear. In a letter to The Advance last week, Mr. Mackay, the Returning Officer for Temiskaming, says:—  
Dear Sirs:—Will you please publish the following as there seems to be some question re the registration of voters in the urban and rural sub-divisions. It will perhaps enlighten the voters.

**Urban Polls.**  
There are five urban polls, in the District of Temiskaming, being Cobalt, Haileybury, Timmins, Iroquois Falls, and Cochrane.

The dates for registration in these Polls are October 31st. to November 5th. inclusive.

On October 8th the Urban Registrars will post their lists in conspicuous places throughout their districts.

His Honour Henry Hartman, Judge of the District Court for the District of Temiskaming, has been appointed Revising Officer. He will give dates when he will sit to revise the said lists.

**Rural Polls**  
The Registrars for Rural Polls will get the information as to who is qualified to vote from such sources as are available to them. An out-of-date list of voters will often provide a useful basis on which to proceed. They will post their notices as soon as possible after being sworn in.

On November 21st. they will post two copies of their lists in conspicuous places, and send copies to each candidate.

From 2 o'clock to 6 o'clock in the afternoon of each day, from November 21st. to 26th., inclusive, they will sit to revise and correct the lists they have made. At six o'clock in the afternoon of November 26th. they will close their lists and these lists as revised will be the ones that will be used for the voters lists on Polling day, December 6th.

### ATLAS GOLD MINES AMONG THOSE EXPECTED TO RE-OPEN

There is a general increase of interest in the West Shiningtree district. Much of this interest is due to the fact that the Hollinger has taken an option on a property in the West Shiningtree Camp and is carrying on a campaign to test out the possibilities of the claims. It is generally felt that the interest of the Hollinger interests indicates at least good possibilities in the area, and this is encouraging to others in the West Shiningtree section. Among the West Shiningtree properties now arranging to re-open active development and exploration work is the Atlas Gold Mines. It is reported that this company will resume operations in the course of a few days, financial arrangements being now well under way and likely to be definitely concluded at any moment. The Atlas has good surface and near-surface showings and other preliminary work done has been encouraging. It is planned to sink the shaft to the three hundred foot level and also to do considerable underground development work. In short, according to present plans, the Atlas will be thoroughly tested out and if it lives up to expectations will be developed into a producer.

### FIRST SUPREME COURT SITTINGS AT COCHRANE.

On Wednesday last for the first time in the history of the North Land there was a sittings of the Supreme Court of Ontario held at Cochrane, Ont. Sir William MuLoock presided, without a jury. The Supreme Court heretofore has held all its sessions for Temiskaming in the County Town of Haileybury. This has been a serious handicap and expense for many litigants and for all the legal fraternity in this part of the North Land. At various times there has been agitation to have cases arising locally dealt with at Cochrane as a much more convenient centre than Haileybury. It is to be hoped that the experiment last week of holding the sittings of the Supreme Court at Cochrane will be followed out in other court matters in cases where the circumstances suggest Cochrane as the more conveniently located judicial centre for the cases to be held. In the past lawyers and litigants of the Porcupine and Iroquois Falls and points west on the National Transcontinental, as well as in the town of Cochrane itself, have been forced to travel literally hundreds of miles and suffer more or less unnecessary loss of time and money through the fact that all courts, except the police court and the Division Court, were held at Haileybury. The North Land has such an

immense territory that the establishment of a judicial centre at Cochrane will find general favour in this part of the country.

### WORK PROCEEDING VERY FAVORABLY AT PENINSULAR

Work at the Peninsular Gold Mines, Night Hawk Lake district, near Connaught, is proceeding satisfactorily and with very pleasing results. About 25 men are busy on the property and everything is going along nicely. The shaft is now down near the second level, about 200 feet, and the work is in good ore. When the shaft is down to the second level it is intended to carry on drifting operations. It is interesting to know that the Peninsular Gold Mines have picked up further ore bodies on the surface, and all the indications are promising and encouraging. Mr. A. R. Globe, formerly assistant general manager of the Hollinger, is in charge of the work at the Peninsular.
