**TECK-HUGHES PLANNING  
TO INCREASE CAPITAL**

Capacity of Mill to be Enlarged. Big Programme of Mine Development.

A meeting of the Teck-Hughes shareholders is being held in Toronto to-day (Wednesday), the chief item of business being the consideration of a by-law to increase the company's capital from \$2,500,000 to \$4,000,000, and offer the new stock, as well as a balance of 220,000 shares yet unissued, first to the shareholders, with the privilege of subscribing for four shares at 15 cents a share for every five shares now held; and the amount not taken up by the shareholders to be subscribed for by the bondholders. The object of the increased capitalization is to provide the necessary funds for increasing the capacity of the mill and carrying on an extended programme of mine development. Recent monthly production of gold at the Teck-Hughes is reported as over \$50,000.00, no less than 3,500 tons of ore of average grade of \$15.00 having been milled in thirty days. The proposed changes and alterations will just about double the capacity of the mine, so it will readily be understood that the by-law referred to has a very important bearing on the future and the prospects of the Teck-Hughes. The Teck-Hughes has delighted all by its expansion and its increased prospects, and there will be a general hope that this Kirkland Lake property will have every possible chance and opportunity at this time to make good.

**COCHRANE ENTERING  
INTERMEDIATE HOCKEY**

The Cochrane Post in its last issue says:—"A meeting of the Cochrane Hockey Association was held on Tuesday night in the Town Hall, the main item on the agenda being the report of delegate to the N.O.H.A. convention in North Bay. This report told of Cochrane having entered a team in the Intermediate series for this coming season. There were a few dissentients to this course of action, but the meeting adopted the report with optimism, being of the opinion that Cochrane should be able to hold her own against Iroquois Falls and Timmins.

"With four intermediate games scheduled here, with the Ladies Hockey team carrying a similar programme to that of their masculine confreres, and with games between local factions, to say nothing of any outside games such as Hearst, etc., hockey should boom in the old town as never before.

The one big handicap here is the open rink, but given good weather and a successful season a covered rink would be bound to come. It's whole-hearted support that counts, and the community, generally should work up a little enthusiasm and help the Association the best way they know how. Subscription lists will be coming around shortly, membership cards are to hand, so now it is up to all of us."

SENT DOWN LAST WEEK**
