#### HELP IN THE HANDLING OF THE CHRISTMAS MAIL

The postal employees always have a special amount of extra work around Christmas time. Consequently Christmas for the post offices and the other postal employees is not altogether the joyous time that poets tell about. Long hours and extra work do not make for joy and Christmas cheerfulness, no matter how happy you may be in your work. Of course, there will be an extra chance for making mistakes around Christmas time with its special rush of work. Employees working too long and too hard are always more liable to make errors than when conditions are normal. It is just here that the general public may help to its own advantage. All the delays or misdeliveries of letters or parcels are not due to the fault of the postal authorities. A recent circular issued by the Post Office Department says that frequently the delay or misdelivery is due to the carelessness of the public in failing to properly address the mail matter in question. Much trouble is due to careless writing, to the use of pencils in writing addresses, and to failure to give the proper street address, or keeping mailing lists up to date. The circular suggests that with the Christmas season at hand, bringing immense quantities of mail to be dealt with it will be necessary that the public adopt more careful methods in the preparation of its mail matter or the average of misdirected mail will assume very great proportions. In

this connection, the following points to be observed are referred to:—Prepay postage fully; address plainly and fully; place name and address of sender on all mail matter; carefully pack and wrap all articles sent by parcel post, but do not seal the parcels as sealed parcels are subject to the letter rate for postage; insure valuable parcels; and last but not least, mail Christmas parcels early. That last suggestion is perhaps worth of special note. "Shop early!" has been a slogan around Christmas time for many years past. Its observance has been a great help to the employees of stores, etc., during the general Christmas rush. "Shop early!" is also mighty good advice in regard to sending letters and parcels by mail. Better a day or two too soon than to wait until the very last minute to add to the rush and worry.

Sudbury has secured the famous Dr. "Jerry" Laflamme as coach for the "Wolves." In its issue of Wednesday of last week, The Sudbury Star says:—

"The best news that has come to the hockey fans of Sudbury and district in many a day is the announcement that Dr. W. J. Laflamme, of Toronto, is to locate in Sudbury and will, in all probability, coach the senior hockey team this winter. Dr. Laflamme has closed negotiations to practice dentistry with Dr. E. A. Hill. Some weeks ago he was in Sudbury and made preliminary arrangements, but it was only Monday of this week that he sent word that he had made up his mind to make the jump north. No definite arrangements have yet been made regarding his connection with hockey, but when he was here on his last visit he expressed himself as quite willing to give the Wolves the benefit of his ability and experience.

"It is generally conceded that no better or brainier hockey player has ever been turned out of Toronto or any other town than "Jerry" Laflamme. As a player he made fame for himself as a member of the famous St. Michael's team; he has been on several Allan Cup teams—in fact, he was the backbone of these champions teams—while his manager-coach-captain-players role with the Granites in recent years has earned for him the cognomen of "the old fox of hockey." Laflamme has long been known as a hockey general—a leader—and his experience is invaluable to any hockey team.

"It was expected that Dr. Laflamme would report tomorrow morning, but he phoned last night stating that owing to illness in his family he would not be able to report until Monday next. He expects to reside permanently in Sudbury."
