**HUNDREDS OF GALLONS OF HOME-BREW SEIZED**

**Police Raid Shacks Down the River And Find Stills, Mash and Finished Goods.**

Acting on information coming to the attention of Chief Greer the police made a raid on a couple of places down the river on Friday evening last and made rich hauls, including a couple of stills and much liquor in the making and other liquor fully made. First Chief Greer, Constable Rayeroff and Officer R. Allen went down the river visiting a shack about five miles from town. It was some distance into the bush from the house occupied by Messrs. E. Colborne and Mose Chartrand. Colborne and Chartrand were placed under arrest for violation of the law in connection with the possession of a still and a large quantity of liquor. When the police arrived the making of liquor seemed to be in active progress. There was a home-made still, worm and all, based on a copper boiler with lid soldered down tight and cleverly piped. At this place five big barrels of "booze" or "hootch" were discovered. There would be about 200 gallons of home-made liquor in this batch. At another shack about 2½ miles away, Pete Sisko was arrested. He is also accused of having a still and having liquor illegally. The police seized the still on the premises. Like the other still it is apparently home-made and manufactured from a wash boiler, though the process of distillation varies somewhat from the other. At Sisko's shack there were about four gallons of booze already made, with three big barrels in the making. The amount of liquor thus seized by the police may be totalled as between three and four hundred gallons. On account of the location of the shacks it was impossible for the police to carry all the liquor and machinery for making. Accordingly samples of the liquor were taken and all the machinery used, such as stills, etc., were brought to town, along with the three prisoners. The police had a busy and strenuous night of it, two trips being made down the river for the work, the second trip being made by Officers Allen, Rayeroff and Roy. Messrs. Colborne, Chartrand and Sisko are being held on a charge of illegally having liquor in their possession. It is likely that another charge in connection with the opera-

tion of the illicit stills will also be made. They will come before Magistrate Atkinson tomorrow, (Thursday) for a hearing.

**IMPORTANT CASES LAST WEEK WERE REMANDED**

Thursday last was a very busy day at the police court here, the number of cases being large and varied. Owing to the fact that the Crown Attorney was unable to be present on Thursday two of the most serious cases were remanded for a week. Remands were also made in some other cases. The remands included:—Jos. Gilbert, remanded for a week on a charge of wife-beating; S. T. Allary, an Austrian, remanded on a charge of conspiracy; M. Hern, charged with attempted rape; remanded to this week; W. Allaire; Mountjoy, charged with the rape of a young girl, remanded to this week.

The cases disposed of on Thursday included a parcel of plain drunks the usual fines being imposed. W. Martin on a charge arising from having home-made liquor was fined \$200.00 and costs. P. Antoine and Amie Antoine were each fined \$5.00 and costs for selling tobacco on Sunday at the Antoine stores on Fourth Avenue and Pine Street. Geo. Mabaseau had five Moneta men up for assault. The five escaped by the paying of the costs. It was apparently only a friendly little row between pals.

Carl Kavilsky, a foreigner charged with living on the avails of prostitution was sentenced to not less than 6 months nor more than 2 years. He was apparently responsible for a married woman, formerly of Haileybury, going astray and running counter to the law. This woman has five children, and her husband was ready to take her back, as well as making restitution of money collected by her for the C.A.S. and not turned in. Magistrate Atkinson let her go on suspended sentence provided she returns to her family and behaves herself in seemly way hereafter.

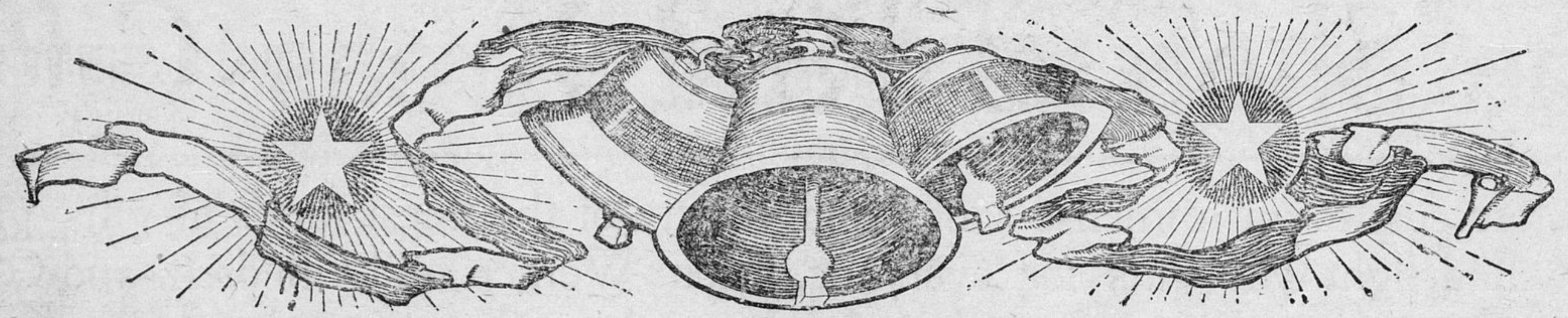
