**177 CHILDREN HELPED  
IN YEAR'S C.A.S. WORK**

Only 19 Needed to be Taken From Their Homes. Excellent Report C. A. S. Secretary.

The following is the report of Mr. R. LeHeup, Secretary and Inspector of the Children's Aid Society of Temiskaming for the year ending Nov. 15th, 1921:-

Mr. Chairman, Ladies and Gentlemen:-

I have the honor to submit herewith the 11th. Annual Report of the Children's Aid Society of Temiskaming, for the year ending Nov. 15th., 1921, year ending November 15th, 1921.

Applications for children, 19; Children brought to Shelter (not wards) 13; Received from Juvenile Court, 10, Children returned to parents (not wards) 11; Children involved during year 177; Complaints received 94; Investigations 93; Meetings addressed 25; Visits out of town 94; Foster Homes heard from 82; Wards placed out, C.A.S. 14; Wards of Soldiers' Aid Com. placed out 9; Wards returned to Shelter 5; Warnings given 52.

In explanation of the above I might add that of the 94 complaints received affecting the interests of 177 children, all were investigated, and as a result your Secretary has been in attendance in Court 53 times, 10 children were made wards of the Children's Aid Society and 9 made wards of the Soldiers' Aid Commission, 4 were committed to the Industrial School, 7 were made wards of the Juvenile Court and placed on parole under the supervision of the Children's Aid Society. In the case of 147 children conditions were either remedied or slight cause for complaint found. 81 wards in the District were visited in their homes and 7750 miles travelled in the interest of children.

As our work becomes better known, the Society's activities are increased, and during the past year our work in the more remote sections of the District has increased greatly. A new feature of our work is the handling of cases of Soldiers' children, such cases, after investigation, are referred to the Soldiers' Aid Commission. There is also the administration of the Act for the Protection of the Children of Unmarried Parents, which will increase our work considerably.

The year just closed has been most successful from almost every point of

view. Two new Branches were started, one in Timmins and one in New Liskeard, and they, in conjunction with the Cobalt Branch, have been most active in supporting the work.

The Shelter is in splendid condition, and the Society is to be congratulated on having as Matron, Mrs. M. Peever; the words of praise and commendation heard from everyone who visits our institution is the best evidence of the splendid work being done by her.

We have received help from so many people this year that it will be impossible for us to thank them all individually in this report, but the continued interest of the Women's Institute Branches throughout the District, the Municipalities of Cobalt, Haileybury, Iroquois Falls and the Township of Coleman and the Society's three Branches has been most gratifying and inspiring, but best of all is the interest being taken by the people generally in our work—we thank them all from the bottom of our hearts.

During the Summer a child brought to the Shelter was found to be suffering from small pox, and in consequence the Institution was placed un-

der quarantine, and fortunately none of the other children took it.

A distinct loss was suffered when Mrs. J. H. Tough of the House Committee removed from the District. Mrs. Tough was one of our most valued supporters, and, before leaving, presented the Shelter with a splendid organ.

The Shelter report showed a total of 36 children cared for during the year. These came from the following places.

Town of Cobalt, 6; Porcupine District, 6; Town of Haileybury 6; Townships 22.

The financial report shows a balance on hand of \$635.93. The receipts for the year from all sources, including a grant of \$3000 from the Provincial Government, totalled \$7120, while the expenditures for the year were \$6,484.02.
