V.N.T. DIRECTORS APPROVE SALE OF TREASURY STOCK

Toronto Syndicate Interested. Mine Likely to be Re-Opened Soon. Shareholders to Meet Shortly.

The directors of the Porcupine V.N.T., at their meeting in Toronto on Thursday last, approved the plan to sell 475,000 shares of the treasury stock to a Toronto syndicate. The price for this stock is understood to be 15 cents per share. This sale of stock will provide ample capital for the early re-opening of the mine and the resuming of milling operations. The proposal seems to meet with general favour, and is looked upon as a very promising matter for the Porcupine Camp. The news that the directors of the V.N.T. had formally approved the sale of the treasury stock as suggested had a very favourable effect on V.N.T. stock last week. On Friday no less than 50,000 shares of V.N.T. stock changed hands on the Standard Exchange market at advances of from 2 to 3 points over the previous day's quotations.

The shareholders of the V.N.T. are to meet at an early date to consider the question and it is generally believed that they will heartily endorse the approval of the directors.

The control of the V.N.T. will remain, as at present, in the hands of the Associated Gold Mines of Western Australia, with headquarters in London, England. The money from the sale of treasury stock, however, will mean a re-opening of the property, at once and the carrying on of exploration and development work on a good scale. Accordingly there will be a general hope that the shareholders will endorse the opinion of the directors and everything go along without a hitch.

VITAL STATISTICS FOR THE TOWN OF HAILEYBURY

In the month of November, Haileybury had 15 births, 4 marriages and 2 deaths.

In December Haileybury gave Mr. A. J. Kennedy a majority of 257 over Mr. McEachren and 422 over the other Angus.

O.H.A. SAYS N.O.H.A. NOT TO INCLUDE MICH. "SOO"

Letter from Ontario Hockey Association Gives Final Decision in the Matter.

At the annual meeting of the N.O.H.A. some weeks ago at North Bay there was an agitation by some, notably the Canadian "Soo," to secure permission for the Michigan Soo to play with the N.O.H.A. There was much opposition to this, the Sudbury team being especially opposed. Eventually, however, the N.O.H.A. meeting by a majority of only one vote passed a resolution asking the O.H.A. to permit the playing of the Michigan Soo with the N.O.H.A. One of the particular objections made against the idea of this resolution was that the O.H.A. having jurisdiction only in this Province could have no control or authority with the players from Michigan, and so it was not believed that the O.H.A. would entertain the application for the Soo to play in an Ontario League. This was the attitude taken by the O.H.A. as will be seen by the following letter received last week by Mr. H. P. Charlton, secretary of the Northern Ontario Hockey Association. This letter reads:—

"Dear Sir:—I have been instructed by the Executive Committee to inform you that the O.H.A. cannot change the terms of your affiliation with the O.H.A. so as to allow of the inclusion of Michigan "Soo" in your Association. The jurisdiction of the O.H.A. is confined to Canadian territory and does not permit of the inclusion of United States territory.
