**REPORT FOLY-O'BRIEN  
'TO RE-OPEN BEFORE LONG'**

Cheque for \$200,000.00 Has Been Forwarded to Ontario Government.

The Temiskaming and Northern Ontario Railway,—the People's Railway,—has had a successful year in 1921, and a noteworthy profit has been made over and above all expenses. Despite the increased expenditures of the present year, the T. & N. O. Railway has shown a profit of \$200,000.00 over expenses, a cheque for this amount having been forwarded to the Ontario Government already. In recent years railways have not been particularly noted as profit-makers and there has been a tendency to fear that publicly owned railroads had a special tendency to the profit-less. The result thus is a proof that public ownership of railways may be a paying venture. The T. & N. O. proves this. Of course, good management is necessary to a public concern as well as to privately-owned enterprises, if profits are to be made. The T. & N. O. has had this capable and efficient management. Under the chairmanship of Mr. Geo. W. Lee, and with attentive and business-like commissioners of the type of Col. McLaren and Col. Martin, the People's Railway might well be expected to get along in first-class fashion. They have given unusual interest, time, attention and effort to their work. And under them there is

a very efficient and careful staff in practically all departments. The general trade depression and the particular drop in the lumber, pulp and paper industries no doubt made the profitable operation of the T. & N. O. more difficult. Added to this was the decline of the silver mining industry. On the other hand, there was a noticeable increase in the business and trade activities in the gold camps, more especially in the Porcupine and Kirkland Lake districts. There was increased business in the gold districts for the T. & N. O. The Commission should bear this fact in mind when planning service and timetables. It seems only fair that special attention and service should be considered for the gold mining districts where business has been good and where the tendency is to expand and increase. The T. & N. O. Railway may well be congratulated on the showing made in 1921.

In the last issue of The Sudbury Star the following of interest appears in regard to the hockey outlook in the Nickel Town:—

"Sudbury's senior hockey squad have been holding nightly workouts at the Palace Rink and if an early start counts for anything, the team should be in good shape when the league season starts. With a solid week's practice, the players without exception have all found their hockey legs, in fact some are going in mid-season form. On the other hand, several are still over-weight and will require two or three weeks to hit their stride. Charlie Langlois is one of these, he tipping the scale now at about 193. His playing weight is 150. Invariably full squads turn out to practice, with a goal keeper in each net. Practice games are held and are witnessed by hundreds of fans, more than have attended some regularly scheduled games with outside teams not many years ago.

Dr. Laflamme is to have full charge of the team as regards say as to who shall, and who shall not play and while the team is in action in practice and in games. He was given a free hand."
