**GOOD PROFIT MADE BY T. & N. C. DURING 1921**

Deal Said to be Under Way at Present Regarding South Porcupine Property.

Every once in so often there is a report to the effect that the Foley-O'Brien may re-open at an early date, but the latest report is said to be an honest-to-goodness one and founded on a substantial basis. It is understood that negotiations are now under way for the securing of a controlling interest in the Foley-O'Brien by important financial interests, and that these negotiations are in excellent way to being carried through to a successful conclusion. If the deal goes through, it will mean that active work will be commenced on the Foley-O'Brien property at a comparatively early date. The development of the Foley-O'Brien would be looked upon with favour as another activity in the Porcupine Camp. It would be a great thing for South Porcupine, the property being right alongside the town at the western outskirts. In the early days of Porcupine great hopes were centered round the Foley-O'Brien. Many old-timers looked upon the property as one of the most promising in the Camp. However, fortune did not favour its testing out and development, and it has never been thoroughly proven up. Through the years that it has laid idle there are many who have continued a firm faith in its possibilities. Men interested in mining in and around South Porcupine have held to a belief in the great promise of the Foley-O'Brien. "We sure would like to see it thoroughly tested out," they have said. If the present deal goes through it appears that they will have their wish.

**FACTS ABOUT CANADA'S NATURAL RESOURCES**

Few people realize that 26,445 Canadian ex-service men have been established on the land and are nearly all making good; that Canada's water-power development represents an investment of \$475,000,000, while the power produced would otherwise require 18,000,000 tons of coal yearly; or that nearly 88 per cent of the world's supply of asbestos comes from the Province of Quebec. The Natural Resources Intelligence Branch of the Department of the Interior, has just issued a revised edition of "Compact Facts," which contains in concise form, information regarding Canada; its area, population, trade and industries; their extent, capital invested, wages paid, values of live stock, principal crops and amounts produced; mineral resources and present production; also forest resources and forest products. Copies of the booklet are available on application to the Superintendent, Natural Resources Intelligence Branch, Department of the Interior, Ottawa.

**SEPARATE DEPT. OF MINES SUGGESTED FOR DOMINION**

The suggestion has been made that a separate Dept. of Mines be created for the Dominion with a Minister of its own in full charge of this important work. This would be all right, for the mining industry is of very great importance to Canada and deserving of the greatest recognition and assistance. At the same time it is important that all should recognize that for a great many years past the Dominion has had a Dept. of Mines, though it has not had a separate Minister in charge. Much useful work has been accomplished by the Dominion Dept. of Mines in the way of geological and other reports and surveys, etc. Indeed, comparatively speaking, the Dominion Dept. has been of much greater usefulness than the Provincial Departments. During the past seven years the Dominion Dept. of Mines has expended over \$3,133,000.00 in prosecuting its work in the interests of the mining industry, or at the rate of nearly \$450,000.00 per year. Surveys have been made of mineral areas, geological reports given out, statistical information gathered, and much of interest and helpfulness made available to prospectors and mining men generally. A minister of Mines in the Dominion Government would of course be welcomed as a recognition of the importance of the mining industry and as promising greater interest and assistance in mining matters.
