

The ballots counted, as given above for the four candidates, totalled 16,-827, and counting with these the 65 ballots spoiled, the total vote cast in the recent election was 16,892.

The vote in the recent General Election was over 5000 more than in the by-election of 1920. In the latter (the by-election) the vote was as foll ows:-McDonald, 5293; Slaght, 3102; Pullen, 3060. McDonald's majority thus was 2,232 in the by-election. In the recent election he had 94 majority over his nearest opponent, Mr. Mc-Eachren.
