MATTAGAMI MEETING VOTES FOR ANNEXATION

Votes to Join the Town Was Unanimous After Situation Had Been Explained.

On Wednesday evening last a meeting of the ratepayers of Mattagami was called at the School House and was largely attended. The meeting was for the purpose of discussing annexation to Timmins or the organization of a separate municipality. The people of Mattagami have felt that some move was necessary at once to properly handle their problems and provide for the future. Their needs for further school accommodation are specially pressing and the people of Mattagami are too energetic and resourceful to let things just drift along. Last summer they made formal application to be annexed to the Town of Timmins, but up to the time of the calling of the meeting, the town had made no active move to the annexing of the section referred to. On Monday last the Council, however, passed the necessary resolution to have Mattagami annexed to the Town and now the matter will be dealt with in due course by the Railway and Municipal Board.

Mr. A. J. Shepperd presided at the meeting on Wednesday evening, and explained the purpose of the meeting. Several of the ratepayers expressed their opinions on the question of annexation, etc., and then Dr. McInnis, Mayor of Timmins, and Councillor L. S. Newton were called upon and explained the attitude of the Town in the matter. Dr. McInnis explained that the Town of Timmins was naturally anxious to add Mattagami to the municipality for several reasons, chiefly for reasons of controlling the dangers of fire and health menaces. The logical destiny of Mattagami was as an integral part of the Town. On the other hand, the Town was in a financial condition that made it utterly impossible for Timmins to promise water or sewerage service or other expensive works to new parts of the town at any very early date. The proposed new section could be promised police protection, lights, fire

protection and perhaps a summer water service at any early date. Further than that it was impossible for the Town to go at present, Dr. McInnis pointed out. Of course, annexation to the Town would assist in the solving of the school problems of Mattagami, and in this regard it would also be of advantage to the Town. After hearing the addresses of the Mayor and Councillor Newton, as well as several pointed speeches from ratepayers present, a vote was taken on the question before the house, and every ratepayer present voted in favour of being annexed to the Town of Timmins.

VICE-PRES. OF ASSOCIATED BOARDS LEAVING DISTRICT

Mr. H. G. Mathewson, for the past ten years manager of the Cobalt Branch of the Bank of Commerce, has been transferred to Dundas, Ont., and so has found it necessary to resign as Vice-President of the Temiskaming and Northern Ontario Associated Boards of Trade. A new Vice-President for the Associated Boards will be elected at the next meeting of that body which will be held in Timmins in the course of the next few weeks.

The removal of Mr. Mathewson from the district, is a distinct loss, as he was both able and public-spirited and the district benefitted in many ways from his keen insight and business ability. In Cobalt he has been one of the effective workers in the Board of Trade of that town, always being active in advancing the interests of the community. He has very efficiently occupied the position of President of the Cobalt Board of Trade. Mr. Mathewson has been very active and helpful also in the work of the Associated Boards of Trade and a valued attendant at practically all the meetings of that body. The Associated Boards of Trade in the circular letter sent out in regard to the resignation of the Vice-President very fittingly says:—"Mr. Mathewson will be greatly missed at the Board meetings, where he has always taken a very great interest in all branches of our work."

The next regular meeting of the Town Council is scheduled for Monday afternoon next, Feb. 27th.

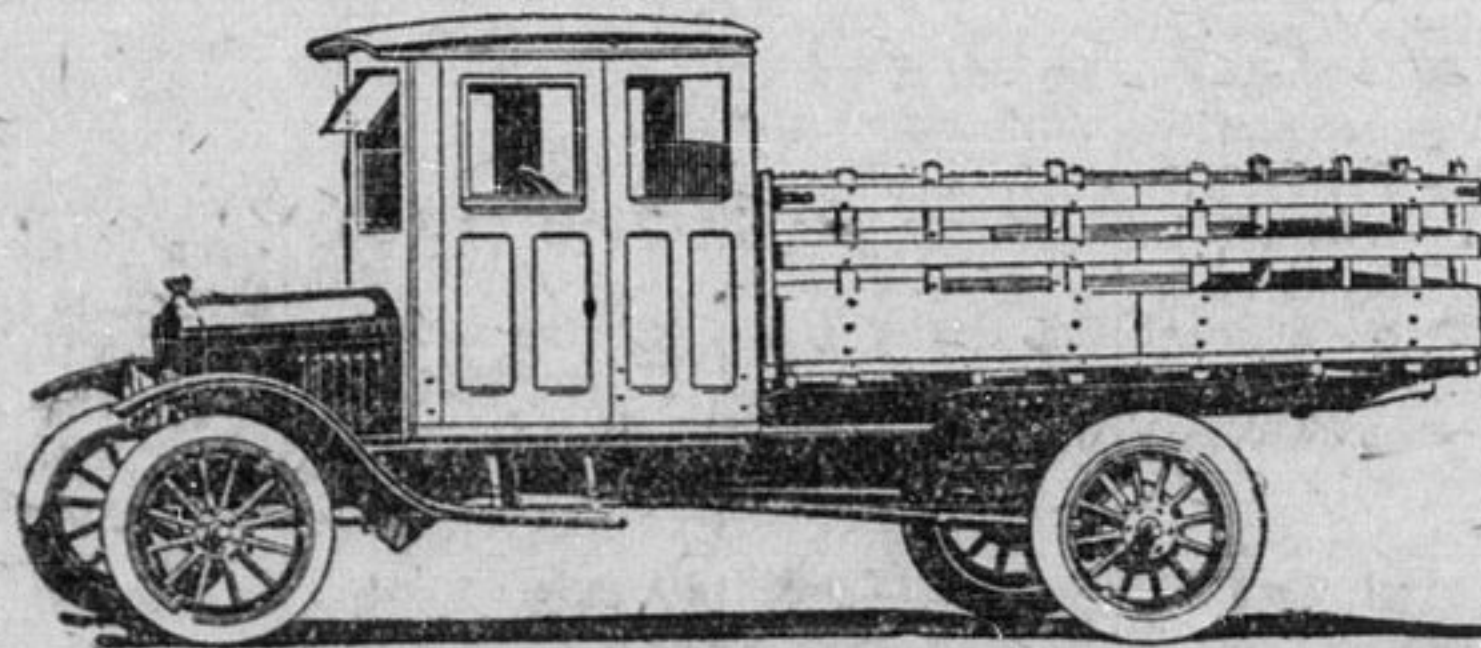
