TOM THOMSON CANADA'S GREATEST ARTIST TO-DAY

Canadians in general will be deeply interested in the pleasing exhibition of Canadian pictures by Canadian artists at the National Galleries at Ottawa. The people of Timmins will be specially interested in the exhibition on account of the work displayed by Tom Thomson, the well-known Canadian artist. Mr. Thomson is a brother of Mrs. Wm. Twaddle of Timmins. Mr. Thomson has become famous for his wonderful paintings of Canadian scenery and life. His pictures are chiefly of the great Canadian out-doors and they have a strength and a charm that make them very attractive. He has specialized in the great scenes of the North and many of these pictures of forest and lake and river have won deserved fame. Mr. Eric Brown, head of the National Galleries, recently referred to Mr. Thomson as the greatest Canadian artist of to-day and the leading critics agree that this is so.

FIVE PER CENT BEER TO BE PROPOSED IN NEW BILL

As Mr. F. C. H. S. would say, "To Beer Not Two Beer,—that is the question!" Whether or not the Government is to stand sponsor for a mea-

sure is to be submitted to the Legislature shortly. The anti-dry bill is now in course of preparation, and will be brought before the House by Sergeant Major J. McNamara, Independent Riverdale and "Nick" Asmusen, North Waterloo, Liberal. The bill will provide for the free sale of beer with a strength of five per cent. proof spirits, in all parts of the province. It has been suggested that a local option clause might, however, be inserted to meet the demands of such municipalities as have been dry since the first local option measure was put in force under the late Hon. W. J. Hanna.

Mr. Raney said this morning that the Government would not introduce any "vital" changes to the O.T.A. this session.

"Would five per cent beer be a vital change?" he was asked.

"Yes it would," replied the Attorney-General.

"Would two quarts a month to householders, be a vital change to make in the act?"

The reply was also, in the affirmative.

REPORT THAT GOLD REEF TO BE RE-OPENED SOON

Among the many mines in the Porcupine district that are generally expected to be re-opened this spring, the Gold Reef is frequently mentioned "on street" these days. It is understood that English capital has been interested in the Gold Reef and that ample finances will be available to resume operations and carry along an extensive campaign of exploration and development. The Gold Reef has been closed down for some time past. About two years ago the Company was re-organized, but at that time labour conditions and the costs of materials were such as to make re-opening impractical. The conditions now, however, are auspicious, and the resumption of work will be watched with much interest. The Gold Reef when under operation some years ago showed much promise and there are many who have great faith in its possibilities. The Gold Reef owns 240 acres.

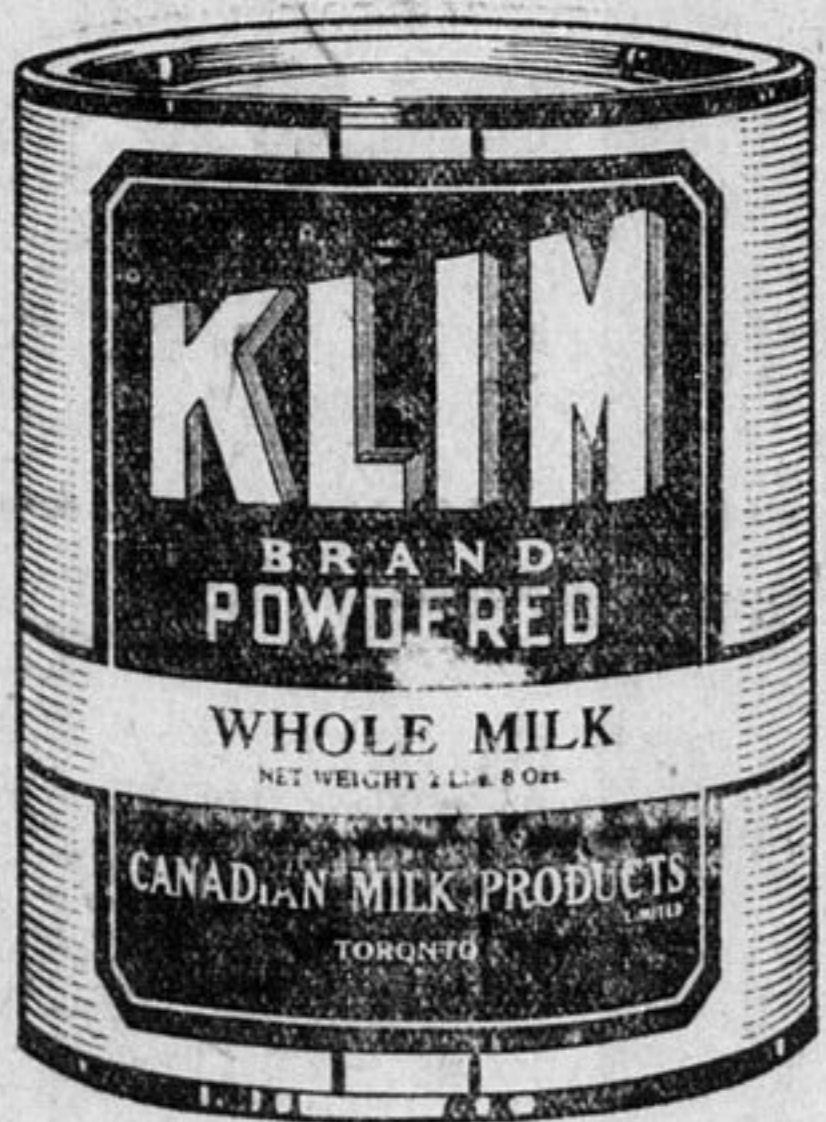
