**ASSAULTING OFFICER PROVES COSTLY AFFAIR**

It cost a man named Laff, fifty dollars and costs for an assault upon Bailiff H. W. Warren. The evidence went to show that the accused had been much incensed by the seizure of a horse he had. Instead of blaming the right person, his resentment had centered against the Bailiff who had simply performed his duties in his usual orderly and kindly way. In any event the accused had apparently hunted up the Bailiff in the evening of the day the seizure was made. He found the Bailiff sitting in the hotel. Before the Bailiff had a chance to rise or even before he knew there was anything wrong, he was knocked down and before he was able to get to his feet to defend himself he was struck again several times. As a consequence of the injuries received he was confined to his home for several days, but even at that was generous enough to suggest that it might fit the needs of the case to allow the accused to go on suspended sentence. Magistrate Atkinson, however, apparently realized the necessity for full protection to officers of the law in the discharge of their duties without interference or undue restraint and so required the accused to pay over the fifty and costs. It is likely that the next instance of similar interference with law officers will draw a heavy jail term, it being an absolute essential of civil as well as criminal law enforcement that officers must be protected against lawless force and interference.

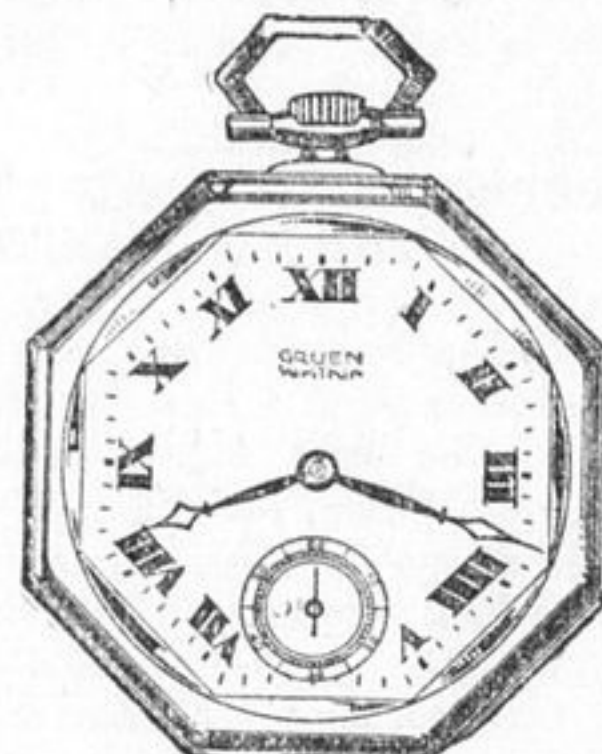
