**AMATEUR ATHLETIC TO MEET FRIDAY EVENING**  
Annual Meeting of Timmins A.A.A. In Council Chamber, Friday, May 5th, at 8 p.m.

The annual meeting of the Timmins Amateur Athletic Association is called for Friday evening of this week, May 5th, at 8 p.m. Last week the date for the annual meeting of the T.A.A.A. was announced as Thursday, May 4th, but since then it has been found necessary to postpone the meeting to Friday, May 5th, at 8 p.m. The meeting will be held in the Council Chamber and all interested in sport in town are invited to attend.

**REPORTED RE-OPENING OF THE PRESTON EAST DOME**

It is currently reported that work will be resumed on the Preston East Dome at an early date, Mr. Wm. Gowen having been engaged to supervise operations. It is understood that sufficient financial arrangements have been made to carry along the work to a successful issue and that a development work of some importance has been planned. The Preston East Dome lies south of the Dome and consequently has a favourable location. Work previously done on the property showed much promise, rich grade of ore being indicated. Conditions following the world war made continuation of the work impractical, but now with more favourable conditions it is hoped that the Preston East Doms will develop into a winner among the Porcupine's mines.

**"THE DEEPER IT GOES THE BETTER IT GETS"**

A brokerage firm in Toronto in one of their news letters touching on Ontario's gold mines says:—  
"Production to date has almost entirely been from above the one thousand foot level. In Porcupine ore is already known to continue to a depth of 3,000 feet, and expert mining opinion is that the geology is such that values should continue to even greater depth. The St. John del Rey Mine, situated in Brazil, is at present producing gold from ore extracted from the 8,000-foot level. The ore of this mine is similar to that of the Porcupine Camp and in rocks of the same geological age. The St. John del Rey has produced continuously since 1829."

**MERGER OF TWO KIRKLAND LAKE MINING PROPERTIES**

Through the organization of a new company to be known as the Montreal Ontario Mines, Limited, with a capitalization of five million shares of a dollar par value each, the plans for merging the Ontario Kirkland Gold Mines and the Montreal Kirkland Mines, Limited, have been successfully consummated. By the merger the new company acquires about 250 acres in the Kirkland Lake gold area. There is also a mill with a capacity of 200 tons per day, as well as a mining plant, the necessary buildings, etc. An extensive campaign of exploration and development work is now being mapped out by a mining engineer of experience and good reputation who is now at the property. By the terms of the merger the new company's executive office will be in Montreal and the majority of the board of directors and the controlling interest of the stock will be in Canada. 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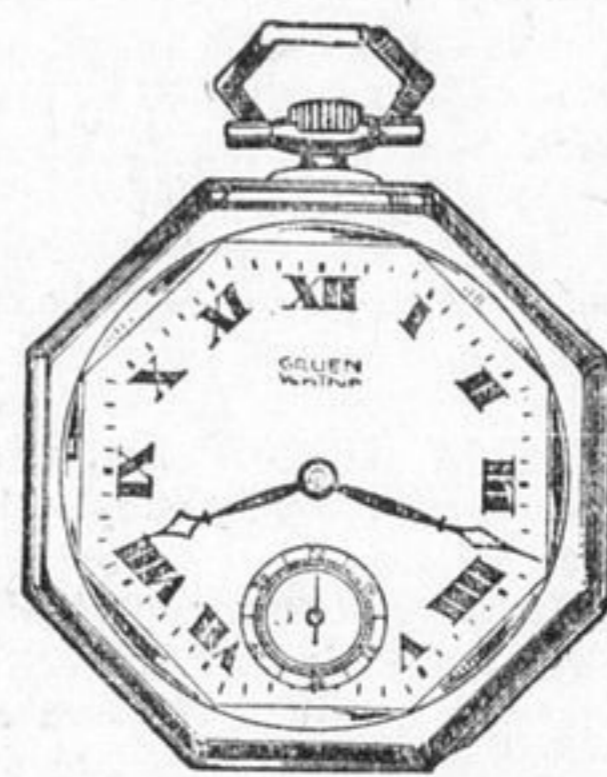
