BOOST FOR PORCUPINE YOUNG LADY IN CONTEST

Miss Olive Orr, of South Porcupine, is one of the many candidates in the contest now being conducted by The Toronto Sunday World. The young ladies winning in this contest will enjoy a wonderful free trip to the Old Country. For the purposes of the contest the Province is divided into three districts: District 1, Toronto; District 2, Hamilton; and District 3, the Province of Ontario, outside of Toronto and Hamilton. Last week's official summary showed that Miss Orr stood fourth in District No. 3. She has 274,800 votes, while the leader in the district has 277,150, the second has 276,000 and the third has 275,750. It is early in the contest yet and Miss Orr, who is deservedly very popular in the Porcupine, has every chance to win. Other candidates in Timmins and South Porcupine have withdrawn leaving the field to Miss Orr. With the whole of the rest of the Province to contend with, Miss Orr may be considered as having a difficult task to win. But if the North Land does its part for one of its own young ladies the win will be easy enough. The candidates for the rest of the Province are scattered through about 50 towns and cities. If the North Land centres on a candidate, the rest is simple enough, and the North Land candidate will be voted in without difficulty.

CANADA'S LOSS IN TIMBER FROM FOREST FIRES

Answering the question, "Has the United States suffered as much from forest fire losses as Canada?" the Canadian Forestry Association says: "Probably more. Much of Canada's forest area has escaped because of its remoteness from human beings who, after all, are the chief cause of forest fires. At present the United States has 81 million acres of absolute desert due entirely to forest fires which killed both the timber and the soil. There are in addition 300 million acres of scrub woods, extremely poor in quality, which are reproducing meagrely and cannot be used for agriculture as the land is too thin. This is the price of human-set forest fires. Canada has paid her full share, for we have about three quarters of a million square miles on which the timber has been killed by fire. That area is mostly non agricultural."

NUGGET'S MILLIONAIRE GIVEN THIRTY-DAY TERM

The mirror repairer named Coterre whom the North Bay Nugget made into the heir of half a million recently was sentenced last week to thirty days in jail for obtaining goods under false pretences. The charge was laid against him by a garage man at the Bay from whom he had secured an expensive automobile on the understanding that he had just fallen heir to \$500,000 through the death of an uncle in the U.S.A. Coterre stuck to his story of inheritance when giving evidence in the court, but claimed that the letters he had received from the lawyer regarding the matter had been burned. A telegram sent to the lawyer he named was returned from Montreal with the information that no such legal light could be found in that bright city. The Judge took the attitude that Coterre's story would not hold anything heavier than moonshine, and accordingly the sentence as above was imposed to discourage this type of imagination.

The little son of Mr. and Mrs. C. P. Casey, Kirkland Lake, died last week from lye poisoning and peritonitis. The youngster who was less than four years old managed to secure a can containing lye and drank part of the contents while his mother's attention was away from him for a minute or two. The child lived for a few days but despite the most skilled medical attention it was found impossible to save the little lad's life.

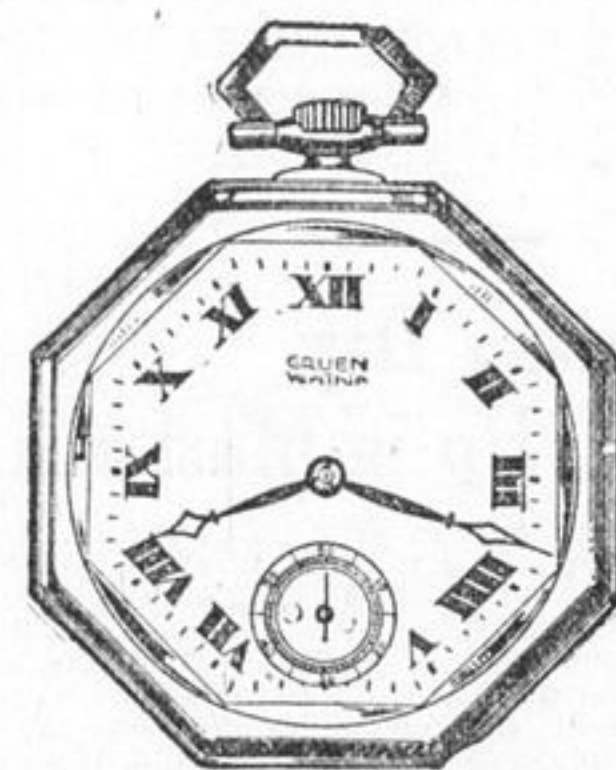
