### HAILEYBURY DROPS OUT OF TEMISKAMING LEAGUE

The following from the last issue of The New Liskeard Speaker tells a sad story for the baseball fans in the three southern north land towns, this side of Latchford. The Speaker says: "Last week we announced that Cobalt, Haileybury and New Liskeard

would provide senior baseball to equal that of last year. Since then a cog has slipped in the baseball programme and it is announced that the County Town (Haileybury), will not have senior representation. This will be a disappointment to those who have always enjoyed the hot arguments between Liskeard and Haileybury ball teams, and will tend to greatly de-

crease the interest in the series. It is generally conceded that Haileybury found the going rather heavy (financially) last season, and following the example set by their hockey management of last winter, they have decided to be "on the outside looking in," while Cobalt and New Liskeard provide the base ball programme for the senior series. Another meeting is call-

ed for Friday evening, when final arrangements will be made for the playing season."

### FIRST TIMMINS DISTRICT FOOTBALL GAME MAY 31st.

The first District Football game for the Timmins Football Club will be next Wednesday, May 31st at the Dome. It is sure to be a lively game with much of interest for the Dome and Timmins have always been keen but friendly rivals in football. The game at the Dome next Wednesday is the second match in the first series of the N.O.F.A., for the Dickson Cup. The next game in the District series will be Kirkland Lake at Timmins on Saturday, June 10th. The Dome is scheduled to play Kirkland Lake on May 24th.

### ATLAS HAS SOME HIGH VALUES ON RECENT ASSAYS

Interest on the market in Atlas had a noteworthy upturn last week due to the favourable reports in regard to recent assays. Twenty-five assays were made on ore from the Evelyn vein. All the samples showed traces of gold some with visible gold and practically all well mineralized. One sample assayed \$243.50 in gold to the ton. The Atlas is now driving to strike the White Rock vein, which, it is expected, will be cut at a much lower level. The renewed interest in Atlas means a recurrence of attention to the other Shiningtree properties where work is being carried on.

### OPENING GAME MAY 24th. FOR THE E. G. DICKSON CUP

The opening game of the District Football League (N.O.F.A.), first series for the E. G. Dickson Cup, is scheduled for May 24th, when the Dome is to play at Kirkland Lake. This promises to be an auspicious opening for District Football as both the Dome and Kirkland Lake have fine teams. Indeed, this year's football all round promises to be specially interesting and the matches all keenly contested. Timmins this season has a fine array of expert and experienced football players and intends to put up a great battle for all the honours there may be in the district. Both the Dome and Kirkland Lake last season won football renown and what they have they intend to hold, if possible. Kirkland boys last season won the Foster Cup, and the Dome had three trophies to the team's credit—the King, Dickson and Goodyear cups. It would appear that the winners of any trophies this year will have to "travel some."

### TORONTO'S INTEREST IN THE NORTH COUNTRY

In view of the discussion at the Board of Trade Smoker on Friday evening at the Hotel Goldfields, the following paragraph from the last issue of The Northern News of Cobalt will perhaps be of interest. This paragraph indicates the feeling held by a great many people in this North Land as to the attitude of Toronto business and financial interests. In fact, there has been such resentment here at times in regard to Toronto's apparent indifference to a very good customer that more than once it has been seriously proposed to institute a business boycott of the Queen City. Rightly or wrongly a great many people up here feel that Toronto does not show the interest or consideration that even business interest would suggest as profitable in regard to the North Land. The paragraph in question from The Northern News is as follows:— "The Toronto Board of Trade is unable to arrange an excursion of members to Northern Ontario this summer, and the plan has had to be abandoned, same as last year. It is understood that so long as their travellers can with comparative ease secure orders in Northern Ontario, merchants and manufacturers of Toronto will not bestir themselves to take a personal interest in the North. A trip to Bermuda would possibly be easier of arrangement. In the meantime the majority of men financing new mining enterprises admit it is easier to get new money in Montreal than in Toronto."

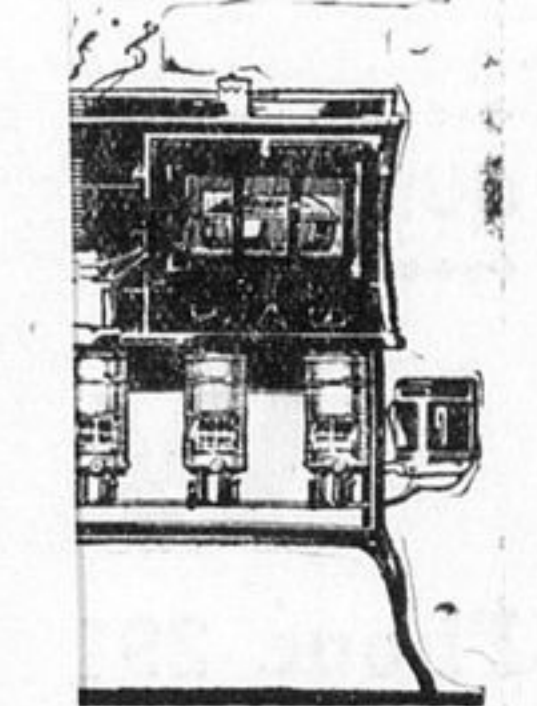
