HOLLINGER SURFACE WON FROM TOWN WITH SCORE 1-0
 On Saturday the Town Football team went down to their second defeat in the local league, the score being 1 to 0 and the Hollinger Surface team being the proud winners this time. The grounds were dry and dusty which made it difficult at times to see the ball, but it was good football and interesting all the way through. There were about 200 spectators present and much enthusiasm was evident in the contest. The Surface won the toss and put the Town facing the sun at 6.30. The Town took up the attack and for the first 15 minutes the Surface goal was in danger. F. Cadman had a shot but Cowan made an easy save. Twaddle got the ball and sent in a hot one which went over the bar. Cowan kicked out a poor one and G. Roberts and Laidlaw got possession and made a nice combined attack. Lightfoot intercepted and saved the situation by kicking out for a corner. Springham put a neat centre but the Surface got it and away they went for the Town goal until Jacobs fouled Twaddle when the latter was attempting to break up the combination. Dunbar followed up a lone rush but failed to pass the ball before he was checked by A. Roberts who sent the ball back for another attack on the Surface goal. Several shots were sent in but had not force enough behind them and were easily cleared by Cowan and the two backs. At the other end the Surface found the Town backs equal to their rushes and Surface chiefly had to be content with long shots which were easy clearing for Street. G. Roberts and Laidlaw made another fine combination run, which proved a close shave for Cowan who, however, managed to put the ball over the bar. The Surface made another combined attempt and Mills sent in a hard one which Street had his work cut out to handle. Three minutes from half-time the Town were awarded a penalty kick for hands. Dalgarno sent a shot in, that Cowan saved easily.

ARRANGING A SURVEY OF NORTHERN ROAD ROUTES
 According to despatches from North Bay, Mr. J. H. Mareau, M.P.P. for Nipissing, has informed the North Bay Motor League that arrangements are being made by the Ontario Government for a complete survey of alternative routes for completion of the trunk highway from North Bay to Cochrane. The surveys will take into consideration such factors as agricultural possibilities of the country, timber and other potentialities, the estimated cost of construction, and the question of the desirability of the route through Temagami or from the present terminal of the trunk road at Widdifield to South Lorrain and following Lake Temiskaming north to Cochrane.

The second half saw things a bit the other way, the Surface starting off with an offensive that gave the Town lots of work to keep the ball out. Then F. Cadman got the ball and rushed it up the field going through the whole Surface team and shooting. Cowan made a fine save, sending the ball back into Town territory. Byrnes got it and dribbled it down the line, sending in a fine cross-shot. Street had to fist it out with two other Surface men right in on him. The Town made another rush. G. Cooper sent in a hot shot that went over the cross-bar. Both goalies were called upon time after time, the ball going from one end to the other, the Surface, however, having the better of the exchanges. A. Roberts was called upon to save the situation, with Jacobs and Mills combining. They had to give way to Andy who sent the ball to F. Cadman, who in turn took another shot. This was a difficult ground shot and Cowan did good work in saving. The ball went back to Dunbar who broke away with Treverton. The latter shot from the wing for the only goal of the match. Street had no possible chance to save this one. From the kick-off Dunbar made a nice run and put in a centre. A. Cooper sent the ball to A. Roberts who was now playing centre half. Andy sent in a fast ground shot which Cowan saved. Laidlaw returned the ball and Cowan just tipped it over for a corner. Springham made a neat corner kick to A. Roberts who sent it over the bar. The whistle found Surface keeping Street very busy to keep the ball out. The Surface showed a much improved condition from a week before when they lost to the Underground. With the introduction of Dedova and Coris they have a much strengthened team and with combination play, they should reverse the last score when they meet the Underground again. On the other hand the Town were very weak on shooting, although their mark was good. Both teams played a fast combination match, neither letting up from start to finish. The line-ups:—
